Help Document the King Tide!

A **King Tide** is coming to New Jersey on Thursday, **October 27**. The Barnegat Bay Partnership (BBP) is asking residents to help document its arrival by submitting photos to the **Barnegat Bay King Tide Photo Initiative**. Photos will help identify coastal areas vulnerable to tidal flooding, visualize projected impacts from rising sea levels, and plan for the future. If you would like to participate, two photos of the exact same location are needed: one taken during an average tide level **prior to** October 27 and another **at the peak** of the King Tide on October 27. Refer to NOAA tide tables at http://tidesandcurrents.noaa.gov/tide_predictions to determine the time of the king high tide. Submit your King Tide photos by uploading them to the Flickr™ group page at <http://www.flickr.com/groups/barnegatbaykingtides>. Additional information is needed for each photo: 1) Record the date and time the photo was taken; 2) Describe the geographic location – GPS coordinates are ideal; 3) Note if the photo was taken during an average tide or King Tide; 4) Note the photo orientation or which direction the camera was facing. The photos and info can also be submitted via email to Karen Walzer at kwalzer@ocean.edu. (NOTE: By submitting photos to the “Barnegat Bay King Tide Photo Initiative,” you are granting permission to the BBP to use them according to the “Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike License.” This means that the BBP will have the right to use your photography in presentations, publications, websites, social media.) Photos will be automatically entered into the **Barnegat Bay King Tide Photo Contest**: Grand Prize – a naturalist-guided Pontoon Boat Tour for 10 to 15 people in spring 2012. 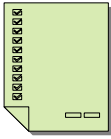

World of the Maya Seminar: January 8-18, 2012

With a Maya archaeologist guide, explore archaeological sites, Spanish colonial towns, traditional Maya villages/markets, meet a Maya shaman, swim in ancient Maya cenotes, take a boat trip through an important ecological reserve in the Yucatan, and stay at the white sandy beaches of Playa del Carmen. KITCHEN KORNER

October Bisque

Ingredients:

1 onion, chopped

¼ cup butter

4 cups chicken broth

28-oz. can whole tomatoes

1 Tblsp. sugar

2 – 15 oz. cans pumpkin

2 Tblsp. fresh parsley, chopped

2 Tblsp. fresh chives, chopped



Method: 1. Chop onion, melt butter in sauce/soup pot, then sauté onion in butter until tender. 2. Add chicken broth to pot and simmer for 15 minutes. 3. Meanwhile, put tomatoes in a blender or food processor and blend until smooth. 4. Add tomato puree/mixture to pot and stir. 5. Add sugar, pumpkin, parsley, and chives to broth/tomato mixture and stir. 6. Heat through. 7. Serve in bowls with fresh, hot bread or crackers on the side. Makes 8 servings.

Pumpkin Fruit Roll Ups

Ingredients: 1 cup pumpkin pie mix

1 cup unsweetened apple sauce

Method: Spray 15x10x1 inch jellyroll pan with non-stick cooking spray. In medium bowl, combine ingredients. Spread evenly into pan and smooth with spatula. Dry in a 140-150 degree oven for 8-10 hours or until surface is no longer sticky to touch. Remove from oven. Cool slightly. Loosen edges with spatula. Start at narrow end, lift up corners, and peel back slowly. Cut into desire lengths, roll up, and wrap each piece in plastic wrap.

Party Mix

Ingredients:

4 oz. M & Ms peanut butter candies

¼ cup crushed peanut brittle/nut clusters

½ cup peanuts (salted or dry roast)

1 ¼ cup Honey Nut Cheerios

1 ¼ cup Corn Chex cereal

¼ cup almonds (slivered)

5 oz. mini pretzels

6 oz. white chocolate chips

1 ½ Tbsp. vegetable oil

Method: 1) In a large bowl, combine M&Ms, peanut brittle, peanuts, Cheerios, Chex, almonds, pretzels. 2) Line two cookie sheets with wax paper. 3) In a microwave-safe bowl, combine white chocolate chips and vegetable oil. Heat in microwave 45-60 seconds. Stir chocolate then microwave for 5 - 10 seconds. Stir until smooth. 4) Pour melted chocolate into dry ingredients and stir well. 5) Spread onto lined baking sheets. 6) Cool for one hour then break apart and store in airtight container.
