TOMS RIVER – Have you lost your major source of financial support because of death, disability, separation, or divorce? Are you emotionally or vocationally unprepared to enter the job market? Do you need additional training or education? Are you working but underemployed? Are you unaware of community resources? If you answered yes to any of these questions, the Displaced Homemakers Program of Ocean County, located at the Ocean County College main campus in Toms River, can help.

The Displaced Homemakers Program of Ocean County provides free services to individuals who have lost their primary source of income due to separation, divorce, disability or death of the primary family provider, and helps them become economically self-sufficient.

Available services include: pre-employment counseling and training, career counseling and planning, educational and training opportunities, academic advising, supportive counseling, information and referrals to community resources and social services, health, wellness, and life skills programs, self-esteem and confidence building, and assistance with job placement.
