## Forget Your MBOS Logon ID?

The “My New Jersey” portal is the access point through which state retirement system members can sign on to the Member Benefits Online System (MBOS). If you cannot remember your Logon ID, you can request that it be e-mailed to you.

The “Logon ID Retrieval” process is similar to the “Password Reset” feature and uses the same user-defined challenge question, response, and e-mail address for confirmation and contact.

**NOTE:** Any registered user who has multiple (valid) Logon IDs that use the same e-mail address but are associated to different systems (such as one logon for MBOS and one logon for another online system) will **not be** able to use this new “Logon ID Retrieval” feature. These users will receive an error message stating they must contact the MBOS Help Desk because the system does not know which Logon ID to send. In addition, users who have changed their e-mail address but not updated it with “My New Jersey” will not be able to use this feature. In this case, click “Help” from the log-on page and use the “Contact My New Jersey” link to provide the correct address. ## Year-End Close Out

It’s time to plan for another year end close! Please keep the following dates and deadlines in mind as we approach the end of FY11.

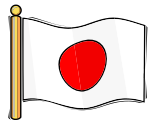
**Purchase Requisitions:** The last day for accepting fully approved on-line requisitions drawn against the 2010/2011 budget (provided funds are available) is **Fri, June 3**. This cutoff date ensures receipt of goods or services **before June 30**. **Note:** Items requiring formal bid or lengthy delivery time will not meet this deadline. Items received after July 1 will be charged to FY2012, regardless of the date ordered.

**Open Purchase Orders:** If you have Open Purchase Orders for items or services not received and no longer needed, notify Accounts Payable so the PO can be closed. Unless a request is made to close the PO, all Open POs not used will be carried over to the new fiscal year. POs carried over will be encumbered against the 2011/2012 budget. Goods and services received prior to June 30 will be charged against the Open POs, but remaining balances will be carried over to FY 2011/2012.

**Blanket Purchase Orders:** Most Blanket POs **expire on June 30**. Only Blanket POs charged to the Capital Account will cross over to the new fiscal year. If you require a Blanket PO for the new fiscal year, you must submit a Requisition **effective July 1**. (When creating a requisition in Datatel, in order for it to be processed in FY12, both the Requisition Date and the Desired Date must be July 1, 2011 or later.)

**Effective Immediately:** Purchasing is accepting Purchase Requisitions and Blanket Purchase Requisitions **dated July 1** and drawn against the 2011/2012 budget. Remember, these POs will not be effective until July 1 and cannot be used for items received prior to July 1.

**Memo Invoices:** The last day for accepting Memo Invoices drawn against the 2010/2011 budget (provided funds are available) is **Fri, June 17**. Memo Invoices received after **June 20** may be charged to the 2011/2012 budget, if appropriate.

## KITCHEN KORNER

### Fresh Summer Tomato Pie - #1

**Ingredients:**

3-4 fresh tomatoes, diced  
salt and pepper, to taste  
½ cup mayonnaise  
1 tablespoon basil, dried  
1 tablespoon chives, dried

1 cup sharp Cheddar cheese, shredded  
1 cup Colby Jack cheese, shredded  
9-inch pie crust, pre-baked  
(frozen or homemade)

**Method:**

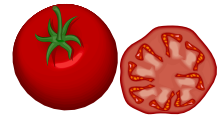
Place diced tomatoes between two paper towels to absorb some of the liquid. Transfer tomatoes to a bowl and sprinkle with salt and pepper to taste. In a second bowl, place mayonnaise, basil, chives, and Cheddar/Colby Jack cheeses, stir to combine. Add in the diced tomatoes and gently stir to combine. Pour mixture into pie crust. Bake at 400 degrees F for 20-30 minutes or until set and lightly browned. Enjoy.

### Fresh Summer Tomato Pie - #2

**Ingredients:**

4 cups fresh tomatoes, sliced  
1 ½ teaspoons salt  
1/8 teaspoon pepper  
¼ to ½ teaspoon basil, dried  
1/3 cup mayonnaise

1 large clove garlic, minced  
1/3 cup Parmesan cheese  
9-inch pie crust, unbaked  
(frozen or homemade)  
evaporated milk

**Method:**

Brush pie shell with evaporated milk and bake at 450 degrees F for five minutes. Place sliced tomatoes in pie shell and sprinkle with salt, pepper, and basil. In a bowl, place mayonnaise, Parmesan cheese, and garlic, stir to combine. Spread mixture over tomatoes. Bake pie at 350 degrees F for 35-45 minutes or until tomatoes are cooked, pie crust is done, and top is browned. Enjoy.
