In the classroom, the team finished with a stellar 3.41 team GPA and has been nominated for NJCAA Academic Team of the Year. Six of the eight players were named to the Academic All-Conference and All-Region teams for the Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 Semesters.

On the court, the team finished with 15 wins and 10 losses. The athletes and coaches weren't charged a single technical foul all season. Erin Applegate and Elizabeth Lawler were named All-Region XIX and All-GSAC. Elizabeth was also named NJCAA Player of the Week for the week of February 15, 2011. She ranked 9<sup>th</sup> in the country in scoring and 2<sup>nd</sup> in rebounding at the end of the season.

Off the court, the team did great things as well. The players all volunteered to work at the Sunny Side Care Facility Holiday Party. The team also took part in raising funds and securing donations for "Kevin's Kids for Christmas Drive" 2010. During the months of January and February the team went "Pink" for

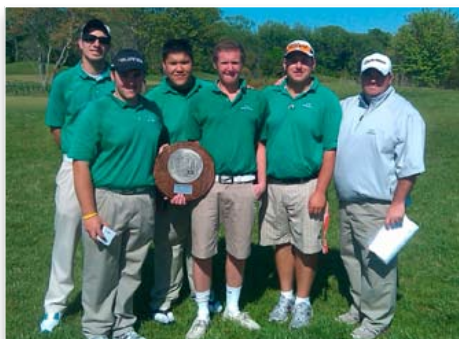

The Ocean County College Men's Golf Team qualified to participate at the NJCAA National Championship in June, held at Chautauqua National Golf Course in New York.

The team finished the NJCAA National Tournament with a score of 1323 for the four days of play. This score earned them 8th place overall in the tournament. Adam Anton finished 31st overall at the championships with a score of 320 and led the Vikings with rounds of 79, 80, 80, and 81. William Hawthorne scored a 331 (83, 83, 82, 83) which gave him a 51st place overall finish. Robert Waszak scored a 335 (88, 82, 85, 80), Nicholas Abbatemarco finished with a 337 (84, 86, 83, 84), and Charles Wright scored a 380 (100, 88, 98, 94).

The Vikings did an excellent job this season. The team finished in 2nd place at the Region XIX Tournament and Adam Anton, Robert Waszak, and William Hawthorne were all selected to the All-Region XIX Golf team for their excellent play. The Vikings Men's and Women's Swim Team traveled to Erie Community College in Buffalo, NY to compete in the 2011 NJCAA Swimming and Diving National Championships from March 2 to 5, 2011. The men's team finished third, and the women finished sixth in the non-scholarship division.

Viking standout Billy de Rouville set three new school records by swimming personal bests at the championships. He set the 50 freestyle with a time of 21.34 seconds, the 100 freestyle with a time of 46.93 seconds, and the 200 freestyle with a time of 1:46.23.

The Vikings also had a number of All-America Honorable Mentions. On the men's team Billy deRouville, Alex Carpenter, Zach Saunders, Kyle Everson, Mark Madjeski, Sean Hirtes, John Boylan, and Nick Brow were all named All-America Honorable Mention. For the women Amy Hrabal, Nicole Haines, Jen Huff, Priscilla Robinson, and Rebecca Siersema were named All-America Honorable Mention.

# Men's Basketball Finish 5th at Division-III Nat'l Championships

**O**n February 27, 2011 the Ocean County College Men's Basketball Team defeated Camden County College to win the NJCAA Region XIX Division III Championship. This win also earned the Vikings a spot in the NJCAA National Championships.

The team played well in the Region XIX Championship game and OCC's Steven Salley was selected the "Joseph A. Papiano Tournament Most Valuable Player." JaMario Clayton was named Region XIX Player of the Year, and Head Coach Rory Caswell was named the "Doug Yennie Region XIX Coach of the Year."

After winning the Region XIX Championship Tournament and finishing second in the Garden State Athletic Conference, the Vikings competed at Sullivan County Community College (NY) on March 10-12 for the NJCAA National Championship.

In the first game, the Vikings defeated Mass Bay Community College (MA) 61-59. JaMario Clayton posted a double-double with 12 points and 11 assists on the day. The lead scorer for the Vikings was Steve Salley, who shot 73% from the field and dropped in 18 points.

The Vikings then played in the National Semi-Final game against the eventual National Champions Mountain View Community College (TX) and lost a heartbreaker 77-71. JaMario Clayton and Jeremy Watkins led the scoring for the Vikings with 16 points each. Steve Salley also contributed posting a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

The Viking's third game was the 3rd/5th place game against the host school, Sullivan County Community College. After a hard-fought effort the Vikings lost 56-53. The team scoring was led by JaMario Clayton with 14 points. Darnell Braggs also chipped in with 14 rebounds and 9 points in the game.

The team played extremely well and did an excellent job representing Ocean County College and Region XIX. For his excellent play over the three day span, Darnell Braggs was named to the All-Tournament Team. Darnell averaged 9.3 points and 11.3 rebounds per game in the tournament. Head Coach Rory Caswell was also named District 6 Coach of the Year.

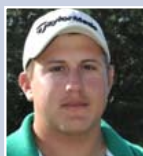

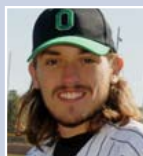

## OCC Recognized Twice at “National Girls and Women in Sports Day” Cohen Receives “2011 Honor Award”



Ocean County College Athletic Director, Ilene Cohen, was awarded the “2011 Honor Award” for her outstanding achievements in athletics and contributions to girls and women in sports in New Jersey. Ilene received her award at Seton Hall University’s “National Girls and Women in Sports Day” in February, and gave an acceptance speech to over 800 people.

Ilene has been involved with playing and coaching since she was a youngster growing up in NJ. In her hometown of Union she was one of the first girls to play little league. In high school Ilene was a centerfielder and the leadoff batter for the Union Farmers where she earned All County in her first high school season. In her junior year of high school she set a school record with a .608 batting average. Ilene went on to earn All State honors as well.

Ilene then selected Trenton State College (now The College of NJ) where she helped the TSC team win the 1987 NCAA Division III Softball Championship with a record of 46-3. As a senior in 1988, she led NCAA Division III with the most hits in a season (74) and was ranked fifth nationally in batting average (.487), earning her All-American status .

Currently, Ilene continues her involvement in athletics as the Athletic Director and former Softball Coach at Ocean County College in Toms River, NJ – a position she has held for ten years. Prior to her appointment at OCC, Ilene was Assistant Athletic Director and Head Softball Coach at Middlesex County College for 12 seasons. Ilene has been a member of the executive committees for numerous organizations (CAANJ, GSAC, Region XIX and NGWSD) throughout her career.

For 20 years Cohen has put forth all of her time and efforts to guiding student-athletes to the next level of their academic and athletic careers. She has drawn on personal experiences received under her former head softball coach, Dr. June Walker, as well as her years of service to community colleges.
