The regularly scheduled monthly meeting of the Ocean County College Board of Trustees was called to order at 3:46 p.m. on Thursday, November 6, 2025, immediately following the Reorganization Meeting, by Mr. Steven Zabarsky, Chair, in room 102 of the Conference Center on the College campus and via Webex. Call to Order

The announcement of public meeting was made by Mrs. Jodi Heitmann in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975. This meeting was announced on October 30, 2025, as required by the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, by providing adequate notice to the Asbury Park Press, the Atlantic City Press, the Ocean County Clerk, and the College community. The notice indicated this meeting would also be held via Webex, as per New Jersey Public Law 2020, Chapter 11, approved on March 20, 2020, for public bodies to conduct meetings by electronic means. The minutes of the October 9, 2025, Board of Trustees closed session and public meetings were unanimously approved by roll call vote. Minutes Approved

In response to concerns raised by students at the October 23, 2025, Conversation with the Trustees, Dr. Monaco introduced Ms. Heidi Sheridan, Executive and Artistic Director, Grunin Center, Mr. Jonathan Molinaro, Dean of the School of Humanities and Fine Arts, Ms. Karin Gargone, Part-Time Teacher of Fine Arts, and Mr. Brian Gilmore, Fine Arts College Lecturer, who addressed comments related to the renovated music practice rooms, the Bosendorfer piano room, and the availability of instruments for student use. The College offers nine practice rooms as of the Fall 2025 semester, up from two in 2018. The Bosendorfer room has been refreshed with sound panels and is available for student practice, lessons, recitals, performances, lectures, and meetings, and rental space and small receptions for the College and community. Many instruments are available for participants in Jazz Band, Concert Band, and the Music Club. The grand opening for the new Music Practice Suite will take place on December 1, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. Presentations

Dr. Monaco then introduced Ms. Brianna Cardinale, Director of Academic and Tutoring Support Services, who addressed concerns about the availability of tutoring support. She shared an overview of tutoring services for historically challenging high-impact courses, taking into consideration enrollment and student success data, while adhering to staffing capacity and budget sustainability. Ms. Cardinale shared the successful impact of tutoring on students in English 1, Accounting I, and Pre-Calculus I.

President's Report

Dr. Monaco shared the following: President's Report

- Ms. Mary Lancaster, Controller, and the entire Accounting team are commended for their efforts in achieving the laudable outcome of OCC being classified as Minimal Risk by the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education following its Fiscal Year 2024 financial assessment, risk monitoring, and financial responsibility evaluation.
- Dr. Monaco shared an email of appreciation by the New Jersey Registry of Interpreters where current and graduate students assisted at the Deaf's Biennial Conference this past weekend.
- OCC and Kean Ocean will celebrate Veteran's Day on Tuesday, November 11, 2025, at 12:00 p.m. on the campus mall. All are invited.
- Dr. Monaco recently met with a GED student who sent a handwritten letter about his positive experience with the program, which led to his interest in helping others like him who have learning disabilities.
- Congratulations to the Men's and Women's Soccer teams and Women's Volleyball team, who made it to the finals this season. The Women's Volleyball team is comprised of all freshman students, with one transfer sophomore student, and first-year Coach and Assistant Coach.
- Appreciation is expressed to the County of Ocean for selecting OCC as the site for emergency food distribution to SNAP recipients and furloughed Federal workers to be held on Tuesday, November 11, 2025, in Parking Lot 3.

Dr. Joseph Youngblood, III, Chancellor of Kean Global, Kean Ocean, and Strategic Global Initiatives, congratulated the Executive Board on their appointment. He then expressed sincere sympathy on behalf of Kean University on the passing of Mr. Dasti. Dr. Youngblood then provided the following Kean Ocean update:

- The “OCC to Kean Pathways” campaign, highlighting the joint admission program between OCC and Kean University will launch in January 2026, providing a seamless transition. Dr. Youngblood would be happy accompany OCC staff on recruitment visits.
- Dr. Jessica Adams has accepted a new position at Kean University. Dr. Youngblood thanked Dr. Adams for her commitment to Kean Ocean and wished her well in her new role.
- An invitation has been extended to OCC Trustees, Dr. Monaco, and OCC’s administrative staff to attend Kean University’s Board of Trustees meeting scheduled on Saturday, December 6, 2025, at 11:00 a.m. in the Gateway Lecture Hall on the Toms River campus.

Dr. Monaco shared that former Phi Theta Kappa Tau Iota chapter President, Areeba Zulkarnain, a current Kean Ocean student, expressed her enthusiasm about the Kean Student Leadership Training session she recently attended.

Dr. Racioppi shared FY 26 enrollment is currently down 33 students (-0.34%) and up 784 credits (-0.73%). The number of dual credit high school students is currently up 152 students (+7.39%) as compared to last year and 991 credits (+7.38%). The return of the Winter session has enrolled 435 students with 1,766 credits to date. The high school class of 2025 enrolled for the Fall semester has a 22% yield, with an increase of 91 students as compared to last year.

Dr. Konopka shared the following Workforce and Professional Education updates:

- WPE held a Business and Industry Leadership Team meeting as part of the Strengthening Community College Training Grant, Health First New Jersey, sponsored by the Federal Department of Labor, providing information to healthcare employers in the county.
- The 2025 Fiscal Year Grant Writing Workshop funded by the Ocean County Department of Human Services for nonprofit organizations was completed, with 47 participants.
- The Ocean County Achievement Center through the Title II grant has 39 students registered for diploma preparation courses.

Mr. Ken Malagiere, Executive Director, OCC Foundation, reported the following:

- The Foundation annual appeal will be mailed at the end of the month, highlighting efforts to inspire recipient donations.
- The Foundation’s annual audit is complete and will be reviewed at the next Foundation Board meeting. Mr. Malagiere thanked Ms. Mary Lancaster, Controller; Ms. Colleen Adams, Accountant; and Ms. Lisa Hussain, Foundation Advancement and Database Coordinator; for their efforts.
- The 23rd Annual Golf Classic raised over \$62,000 to benefit students at Ocean County College. Thanks to Ms. Julia Zipp, Associate Director of Advancement and Donor Engagement, for generating an 18% increase in revenue over last year.

Upon a request for public comments, several students expressed concern regarding Engineering, Public Comments English, and Political Science courses not being offered due to low demand and asked the trustees and Administration to consider reinstatement. Mr. Zabarsky commended the students for taking the time to share their concerns and assured them that a response will be shared once the situation has been reviewed.

Mr. Zabarsky recognized Commissioner Virginia Haines and commended her long-standing support of Ocean County College.

With no further comments from the Board members or the public, the meeting adjourned at 5:05 p.m. Adjournment
