Robert J. Novins Planetarium

As announced at last month's Board meeting, a fundraising campaign was established to support the renovation and renewal of the Robert J. Novins Planetarium. Through the efforts of Mr. Stephan Leone, who is serving as chair of the campaign, the Board's Ad Hoc Committee on Planetarium Fundraising and Publicity, which is chaired by Judge Robert Fall, the Ocean County College Foundation, and the College Advancement team, the campaign kick-off has been scheduled for Friday, May 4th, at 10:00 a.m. at the Planetarium.

This event will officially begin the aptly-named "Reach for the Stars" campaign to raise the funds needed to replace outdated equipment as well as to renovate the facility to provide rich astronomical, scientific, and cultural learning opportunities that will be equal to the best available in today's world of digital technology. Invitations to attend the kick-off are being extended to legislators, community leaders, county organizations, educational administrators and teachers, and media outlets.

Mr. Leone will keep the trustees informed on the progress of this exciting and challenging campaign.

This year's recipient is Mrs. Priscilla Oughton, who graduated from Ocean County College with an associate in science degree. As noted in my report to you last month, this statement encourages all governing boards and chief executives to examine the clarity, coherence, and appropriateness of the institution's governance structures, policies, and practices. I will share the AGB Statement with you prior to the May 11th retreat.

New Jersey Council of County Colleges

The next educational seminar sponsored by the New Jersey Council of County Colleges for community college trustees is scheduled for Monday, April 30th, from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. at Forsgate Country Club in Monroe Township. Dinner will follow the seminar.

The title of this seminar is "Community Colleges and High Schools Working Together to Improve Student Success: Aligning Public School Standards with College Readiness." Ms. Lucille E. Davy, New Jersey Commissioner on Education, and Dr. Kenneth Ender, President of Cumberland County College and Chair of the New Jersey Community College Presidents Association, will provide an overview of the American Diploma Project and the work of the High School Redesign Steering Committee. The purpose of this committee is to align the outcomes of high school education with the expectations of work/college to promote a workforce that can meet 21st century expectations while reducing the need for college remediation programs.

Phi Theta Kappa

Six members of the Executive Committee of OCC's Tau Iota Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa and faculty advisor Dr. Joaquin Rolon, Professor of English/Literature, attended the Phi Theta Kappa International Convention held in Nashville, Tennessee, from April 12th to 14th. This multinational event, the world's largest gathering of community college honor students, featured three days of education, information, instruction, and fellowship. Phi Theta Kappa faculty advisors, alumni, and administrators also attended the convention.

I am delighted to inform you that OCC's Tau Iota Chapter, for the first time in the history of the college, was the recipient of a Distinguished Chapter Award, which was presented to only 25 of the 1,200+ member chapters located in all 50 of the United

States, U.S. territories, British Virgin Islands, Canada, Germany, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, United Arab Emirates, and Palau.

To be considered for a Distinguished Chapter Award, a chapter must submit applications and extensive essays for Scholarship, Leadership, and Service Hallmark Awards. The scores in each of these categories are averaged to determine a chapter's overall ranking.
