Ocean County College Board of School Estimate

On Wednesday, February 15, 2006, Ocean County College Board of School Estimate members Freeholders James Lacey, John Kelly, and Gerry Little and Board members Mr. Van Thulin and Mr. Jerry Dasti met to consider the College's FY 2007 budget request. Also in attendance with me at the meeting were Mrs. Eva Smithers, Secretary of the Board, Ms. Sara Winchester, Dr. Richard Parrish, and Ms. Connie Bello.

Once again, the County of Ocean has demonstrated its strong support for the College by increasing its funding in FY 2007 by 5% over last year, contributing \$13,460,460 of the proposed \$47,855,351 total operating budget. The Freeholders were extremely complimentary of the College and specifically commended the new partnership with Kean University, which will benefit all the residents of Ocean County, and the NJ STARS Program, which has been expanded to include four years of college leading to a bachelor's degree.

Phi Theta Kappa Award

I am extremely pleased to inform you that I have been selected to receive a 2006 Shirley B. Gordon Award of Distinction from Phi Theta Kappa. OCC's Tau Iota Chapter nominated me for this award, one that is given to outstanding community college executive officers who have provided extensive support and a variety of resources to promote their PTK chapters. This award is very special to me in that it was our Phi Theta Kappa students who believed I was worthy of consideration.

The award will be presented on Friday, April 21, 2006, at Phi Theta Kappa's 88th Annual International Convention in Seattle, Washington. A recognition luncheon is scheduled which will include Convention Keynote Speaker Madeleine Albright, former U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations and former U.S. Secretary of State. President of our Tau Iota Chapter, Mr. Michael Mayo, will join me at this convention. Approximately 3,600 Phi Theta Kappa members, college faculty, and college presidents from throughout the nation will be in attendance at the convention.

New Jersey Council of County Colleges

Dr. Larry Nespoli, President of the **New Jersey Council of County Colleges**, will **join us** at our meeting on **Monday**. On behalf of the Council's other **eighteen community colleges**, he will present to the Board of Trustees a **commemorative plaque** in **tribute** to

Mr. William T. Hiering. In addition, he will provide an update on the Council's activities

I want to remind you of the Council's educational seminar, "Reflections of a Community College President Upon Retirement," that is scheduled for Monday night after the Board meeting from 5 to 6 p.m. at Forsgate Country Club in Monroe Township. Dr. Phyllis Della Vecchia, President of Camden County College since 1993, will retire this month, and she has graciously agreed to share insights and observations as a community college leader, especially focusing on the respective roles of the President and the Board of Trustees in leading our colleges.

Division of Economic and Workforce Development

The **Division of Economic and Workforce Development** addresses diverse community **educational, training,** and **enrichment opportunities**. We are pleased to highlight **three programs** that reach out to **address needs** not served by traditional college programs:

- ◆ The Continuing and Professional Education (CPE) Department offers a comprehensive array of medical and allied health programs leading to immediate and well-paid employment. In Ocean County, the healthcare industry is projected to have the greatest employment growth through 2012. Under the direction of Ms. Kathy Caro, these allied health programs have placed highly skilled employees in area healthcare facilities.
- ♦ The college's Academy for Lifelong Learning (ALL), under the direction of Ms. Joanne Padrone, provides quality programs for adults 55 and over to enhance their intellectual, physical, and personal well-being. Almost 35% of county residents are 55+, so this is a mutually beneficial partnership between the college and community.
- ♦ Finally, the Center for Business Education and Training develops training solutions for local businesses to improve productivity, reduce costs, and strengthen their competitiveness. Customized training coordinator Ms. Kathy Baranowski will present some examples of the college's response to the needs of local businesses.

International Education - "World of the Maya"

Ms. Christine Kitchin, Assistant Professor of Social Science, will present a brief summary of the OCC "World of the Maya" Study Abroad Seminar which she led to the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico from January 6 to 17, 2006, in conjunction with OCC's International Education Program. Thirteen students and community members participated in this twelve-day travel seminar, part of a three-credit OCC anthropology course.

In this hands-on learning experience that combined anthropological, archaeological, and ecological perspectives, the group studied Maya life ways past and present, including change and continuity in art and architecture, religion, social organization, and daily customs. They explored the archaeological ruins of eight ancient Maya cities, the caves and cenotes used for sacred ceremonies, a number of modern Maya villages, and several Spanish colonial towns. The OCC students were especially grateful to receive support from the OCC Foundation in the form of \$300 scholarships, which helped to defray the costs of the trip.

Ocean County College Athletics

The Ocean County College women's soccer team compiled a record of 11-3 and won both the Garden State Athletic Conference (GSAC) and the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Region XIX Championship. Maggie Chussler was named to the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-America team.

Nicole Laureigh was named to the NJCAA All-America team. She was also named to the NJCAA All-Region and GSAC All-Conference teams. In NJCAA Region XIX, Nicole was named the Number One Top Player for 2005 Division II Women's Soccer.

In addition, Veronica Dilzer and Elizabeth Root were both named to the GSAC All-Conference and NJCAA All-Region teams.

The men's soccer team also did well this season. Tadas Simmios and Brandon Benoit were both named to the GSAC All-Conference and NJCAA All-Region teams. Sean McGinley was named to the GSAC All-Conference team.

The coaching staff of Karen Trump, Terry Byrnes, and A.J. Trump was named Coaching Staff of the Year 2005 in both the GSAC and NJCAA Region XIX for the accomplishments of their teams.

Twenty-six OCC student-athletes have been named to All-Academic Teams for 2005-2006. To qualify for the Academic All-Region Teams, a student-athlete must have a grade point average of 3.25 or better. A grade point average of 3.0 or better is required in order to qualify for the Academic All-Conference Team.
