Ocean County College FY 2007 Budget

The proposed Ocean County College FY 2007 budget will be presented to the trustees for approval at the special budget meeting/retreat on Friday, January 27, 2006, at 3:00 p.m. Following approval by the trustees, the proposed budget request will be presented to the Ocean County College Board of School Estimate in February. The five members of the Board of School Estimate include Freeholders James Lacey, John Kelly, and Gerry Little and Board members Mr. Van Thulin and Mr. Jerry Dasti. Mrs. Eva Smithers serves as Secretary of the Board.

Spring Semester Colloquium

On Wednesday, January 18th, the college community met for the Spring Colloquium in the Fine Arts Theatre. The morning began with a continental breakfast at 8:30 a.m., with the program beginning at 9:00 a.m. My address focused on the subject of global technology, not only as it affects our College but also as it affects our lives, our communities, our society, and the future of our children. Dr. James McGinty and Dr. Frank Wetta also presented information on plans and accomplishments relating to emerging technology support services and technological innovations in teaching and learning.

Following the program, three workshops were offered for faculty:

- Critical Thinking: Moving from Theory to Classroom Implementation
- ♦ Writing Across the Curriculum: Fostering Writing throughout the Academic Disciplines
- ◆ Uncivil Behavior in the Classroom: Responding to Lack of Civility and Problematic Behavior

NJ STARS II

Acting Governor Codey signed the NJ STARS II legislation into law on Friday, January 13, with the bill becoming effective immediately. Current NJ STARS sophomores who graduate with an associate degree with at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average will be eligible for scholarships for their junior and senior years at New Jersey public senior colleges and universities.

Highlights of the **NJ STARS II** bill are:

- ◆ Each participant will receive a \$2,000 scholarship for each semester of enrollment commencing in the 2006-2007 academic year.
- ◆ This scholarship is in addition to any other grants and merit scholarships to which the student is entitled.
- ◆ Provided the student **maintains eligibility** for participation, the NJ STARS II scholarship will be available for **up to four semesters**.

This program, unique to New Jersey, provides an outstanding opportunity for serious and accomplished students to participate in the NJ STARS Program for four years, two at the community college for an associate degree and two at a senior public institution to complete their bachelor's degree.

Dr. Dan Duffy and current student **Eric Scherm** will give a **brief report** on the NJ STARS II Program at **Monday's meeting**.

Visiting Scholar

At Monday's meeting, I will introduce to you **Ms. Wei Zhang**, our **Visiting Professor** from **Xi'an International Studies University** in **China**. Ms. Zhang will be with us for the **2006 spring and fall semesters**. During her time at OCC, she will be **teaching two courses in English** in the **spring semester** and **two Business courses** in the **fall semester**.

Ms. Zhang is an **Associate Professor** in the **Business School of Xi'an University**. At Xi'an, she teaches **English, Business English Listening, and English Writing**. She holds a **master of arts degree** in **linguistics** from Xi'an University.

We are extremely **pleased and excited** for Ms. Zhang to be a part of our College community. Her presence here follows **Professor Karl Kleiner's teaching** at **Xi'an University** last year.

I also want to bring to your attention that OCC is being considered to host a Fulbright Scholar from Egypt during the 2006-2007 academic year. This is a unique opportunity; few community colleges have been selected for Fulbright Scholars in Residence. We will keep you informed

of the progress of our application and the decision of the **Fulbright Scholarship Board**.

Student Leadership Development Conference

The College's annual Student Leadership Development Conference was again held at the Villa Roma Hotel in Callicoon, New York. On Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, January 11th, 12th, and 13th, Judy and I joined 35 students to explore leadership, communication, and teamwork. Also were in attendance were 8 faculty and administrators, Mr. Don Doran, Dr. Dan Duffy, Dr. Frank Wetta, Dr. William Rickert, Ms. Nancy Polonitza, Ms. Kathleen Bombery, Ms. Alison Miller, and Ms. Jen Kane.

My attendance every year reinforces my belief that Ocean County College's leadership program is the best student activity I have ever encountered. This program has been in existence for many years, and it has been perfected by the Student Affairs Division, specifically Dan Duffy, Don Doran, Nancy Polonitza, as well as all of the other conference facilitators who assist in making this an extraordinary experience for the participants, especially the students as they continue in their growth and development.

Interpreter Training Program

The Toms River Board of Education has accepted Superintendent of Schools Michael Ritocco's recommendation to award \$1,000 to the OCC Interpreter Training Program. This donation is in appreciation for the efforts of ITP students who performed at the RiverFest celebrations.

Ms. Linda Sitek, an OCC interpreter who teaches Basic American Sign Language I and II and who works for the Toms River School System will present the check at Monday's meeting on behalf of the Board of Education to Ms. Kathleen Basilotto, program instructor, and Dr. Martin Novelli, Dean of Humanities, Fine Arts, and Media. We are indeed grateful to the Toms River Board of Education for its recognition of OCC's very successful and popular Interpreter Training Program.

I BOAT NJ Program Grant

The New Jersey Department of Transportation's Office of Maritime Resources awarded to Ocean County College an \$83,423 grant under its I BOAT NJ Program in support of the development of the J. Phillip Citta Community Sailing Center at Mill Creek County Park in Berkeley Township. The proposal was submitted by the college in July, awarded by the Department of Transportation in August, and accepted by the Board in September.

The purpose of the grant is to **conduct a survey** of the **existing site conditions** relating to **property boundaries** and **topographic data**, **analyze** existing **environmental conditions**, and **prepare** detailed engineering **site drawings** in preparation for architectural design and construction of the Center.

The J. Phillip Citta Community Sailing Center will house the OCC School of Seamanship and Sailing, including the OCC Sailing Team, the OCC Community Sailing Program, Sail-Habitation, and other programs as they are developed.

Black History Month

February is designated **nationally** as **Black History Month**. I respectfully request that the Board of Trustees adopt the attached resolution **proclaiming February** as **Black History Month at Ocean County College.**

Community College National Legislative Summit

More importantly, however, attendance at the conference allows us to **schedule meetings** with **state and national legislators** to discuss issues of concern to Ocean County College.
