Ocean County College Library

OCC recently acquired Sirsi's integrated **Library software**, **Unicorn**, which provides the OCC community with a greatly **expanded menu of library services**. For the students, faculty, and staff of the college, Unicorn provides not only a **state-of-the-art online catalog** of our materials, but also **Electronic Reserves**, integrated **electronic books** and a wide array of **personal services**. For the Library staff, Unicorn incorporates nearly all of our public and behind-the-scenes services, such as **electronic book ordering** and an extensive and versatile **reporting system**.

I have asked Ms. Yvonne Huacuja, Director of Library Services, and Ms. Tracey Hershey, Reference Services Librarian, to provide you with a brief report at Monday's meeting on the software being utilized in the Library.

Colloquium

The Spring 2005 Semester Colloquium took place on Wednesday, January 19th, in the Fine Arts Theatre. It began at 8:00 a.m., with a reception and continental breakfast. At 9:00 a.m., I presented my State of the College Address to begin the spring semester. After my presentation, the faculty remained in the Theatre to meet with Dr. Frank Wetta. As in the past, workshops were offered for administrators, support staff, and faculty during the day. A similar program occurred at 5:30 p.m. in the Theatre for adjunct faculty.

Ocean County College Board of School Estimate

Following the action of the trustees to approve the Ocean County College FY 2006 budget request on Monday, the Ocean County College Board of School Estimate will meet on Wednesday, February 9th, at 3:00 p.m. in the Ocean County Administration Building. At that time, the college's funding request from the County will be

considered, as will a request to approve both a resolution for FY 2006 capital facilities projects, with the State and County both funding fifty percent of the cost, and a resolution for the Higher Education Equipment Leasing Fund Act, the last installment of the County's five-year commitment. The five members of the Board of School Estimate include Freeholders James Lacey, John Kelly, and Gerry Little and Board members Mr. William Hiering and Mr. Van Thulin. As always, Mrs. Eva Smithers will attend as Secretary of the Board of Trustees.

Community College National Legislative Summit

The National Legislative Summit, which is sponsored by the Association of Community College Trustees and the American Association of Community Colleges, is being held from Sunday, February 13th, through Wednesday, February 16th, at the J.W. Marriott Hotel in Washington, D.C. Judy and I plan to attend with Assemblyman Dave Wolfe and Ms. Tara Kelly.

I always look forward to this summit because it provides a wonderful opportunity to meet with state and national legislators. We are extremely fortunate that Assemblyman Wolfe is scheduling personal appointments with our district officials. In addition, the Council of County Colleges is hosting a special reception for New Jersey's community college trustees and presidents on Monday, February 14th, as well as a breakfast on Capitol Hill on Wednesday, February 16th, with Congressman Jon Corzine making a commitment to be the guest speaker.

The resolution will be formally presented to Mr. Citta at an appropriate occasion upon his return from Florida.

Interpreter Training Program

A ceremony was held for the first 40 graduates of the Interpreter Training Program on Friday, January 7th, in the Fine Arts Theatre. In recognition of the great demand for qualified interpreters, both at the state level and nationally, the college began the certificate program in fall 2002. Ms. Kathleen Basilotto, now an instructor in the program, was instrumental in the establishment of the program and the development of its courses.

Even before the students graduated, many were **offered and accepted employment** as interpreters in **various school districts**, some of which include the Toms River Regional

School District, the Pinelands Regional School District, the Lacey Township School District, and the Freehold Vocational Technical School.

As a result of the success of and need for these graduates, **consideration** is being given to **developing an associate degree program** in sign language interpretation, which would include **specialized training programs** such as **medicine and law**.

Ocean County College Sailing Program

The **OCC Sailing Program** had an extremely **successful fall semester**. I am pleased to share with you a list of our **sailing "firsts":**

- ♦ First time OCC qualified for and competed in the War Memorial regatta, the NCAA tournament of sailing comprised of the top 16 teams in the Middle Atlantic Intercollegiate Sailing Association (MAISA).
- ♦ First time OCC hosted the MAISA Clinic.
- First time OCC hosted a fall regatta, with 18 boats competing.
- **♦** First time OCC **competed in the Atlantic Coast Championships**.
- ♦ First time OCC won the Colgate Open.
- ♦ First time OCC won the Washington College Open.
- ♦ First time OCC finished in the top three in a women's regatta.
- ♦ First time an OCC A and B sailor finished a race in single digits in the War Memorial regatta.
- First time OCC had 15 sailors on the intercollegiate team.
- First time OCC athletes **competed for the Seibert Trophy**.

Under the leadership of Mr. Don Doran, Dean of Student Affairs, and Mr. Roy Wilkins, Manager of the Sailing Program, and with a blue ribbon advisory committee headed by Dr. Drew Seibert, the Sailing Program was established and is operating entirely on private donations. In fact, the advisory committee recently embarked on raising an endowment that will keep this program operating without public funding in perpetuity.

Black History Month

The month of **February** is proclaimed **nationally as Black History Month**. The **Office of Multicultural Services** has developed a number of **college activities** to celebrate Black History Month, which are listed on the attached flyer. Of special note is the **Gospel Show**, which will be held on **Friday**, **February 18th**, at 7 p.m. in the Fine Arts Theatre. This is an **excellent**, **energetic**, **and moving performance** that I am sure you would enjoy.

Student Leadership Development Conference

Judy and I had the pleasure of again participating in the college's annual Student Leadership Development Conference, which was held at the Villa Roma Hotel in Callicoon, New York, for the second year. Forty students, representing the majority of the college's student clubs and organizations, gathered on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, January 12th, 13th, and 14th, to explore leadership, communication, and teamwork. Specifically, the conference focused on managerial problem solving and decision making, motivational leadership, interpersonal communication and conflict resolution, and values clarification and commitment.

As I have shared with you in the past, this student activity is **excellent**, and I am always **rejuvenated** when I return to campus after having had the opportunity to **interact so closely** with our students and with the administrators and faculty who participated: **Dr. Dan Duffy, Mr. Don Doran, Dr. Frank Wetta, Ms. Maureen Reustle, Ms. Jen Kane, Ms. Alison Miller, Dr. Beth Brierley, Mr. Ted Gordon, Dr. Bill Rickert, and Ms. Nancy Polonitza.
