Ocean County College Security

In April 2007, I requested that the College's emergency management systems and procedures related to campus security be reviewed and updated. Since that time, the OCC Emergency Manual has been revised and, utilizing new technologies, communication systems have been implemented to better **communicate** with **students** and **employees**.

Middle States Periodic Review Report

The College's five-year Periodic Review Report is due to the Middle States Commission on Higher Education by June 1, 2009. This report will take the form of a modified self-study, which will include six sections: An executive summary, a status report on the 2004 Middle States visiting team recommendations, a brief summary of the College's major challenges and current opportunities, enrollment and financial projections for the next five years, evidence that the outcomes assessment processes are in place and the results being utilized, and evidence that linked planning and budgeting are in place.

Since October 2007, the Steering Committee was established, subcommittees were identified and have met to review documents and collect data, and reports of findings are being drafted.

Ms. Janet Hubbs, Assistant to the President for Institutional Quality and Chair of the Steering Committee, will update you on Monday on the progress being made on the Periodic Review Report.



New Jersey Council of County Colleges

I hope you will be able to join us for the New Jersey Council of County Colleges' "Best Practices and Best Principles" conference for New Jersey community college trustees, presidents, and foundation board members on Monday, June 16th, from 3 to 8 p.m. at the Trenton Marriott at Lafayette Yard Hotel.

OCC was selected to be one of the three presentations at this conference. Judge Robert Fall and Mr. Dave Wintrode will present OCC's best practice, "The Reach for the Stars Campaign: A Success Story."

The recipients of the 2008 New Jersey Council of County Colleges Legislative Excellence Award and the 2008 New Jersey Community College Spirit Awards will also be recognized at the June 16th conference.

The Ocean County College Foundation

The OCC Foundation's Executive Board, at its meeting on Wednesday, June 11th, approved the concept of a new scholarship program, OCC STARS 21, which will provide financial assistance to Ocean County students who graduate with a high school class rank of 21% to 30%. As you know, the NJ STARS Program provides full tuition aid to high school students who graduate in the top 20% of their class. This new Foundation program will recognize and reward those students in the next 10% who are also high achievers and deserving of scholarships.

It is anticipated that OCC STARS 21 will begin in fall 2009 following a fundraising campaign during the next year to gain support for the program. The specific criteria for the program will also be determined during the next year.

American Association of Community Colleges

I am attending the American Association of Community Colleges' Presidents Academy Summer Institute in Kennebunkport, Maine, from Sunday, July 13th, through Thursday, July 17th. This Institute is dedicated to the professional renewal and recognition of community college CEO's and is considered one of the premier professional development experiences, providing an opportunity for indepth examination of various topics, using veteran presenters and actual case studies.
