Ocean County College Foundation Gala

The Ocean County College Foundation Gala, "An Evening Under the Stars," is scheduled for Saturday, September 8th, at 6 p.m. on the college campus mall. This year's Humanitarians are Mr. Stephan Leone and his wife Judith.

The OceanFirst Foundation continues to be a major sponsor of the Gala, once again donating **\$55,000** to support this year's event. The OceanFirst Foundation will present this gift at the Foundation's July 11th Executive Committee meeting.

The **proceeds** of the **2007 Gala** will benefit the **Robert J. Novins Planetarium** through the **"Reach for the Stars"** fundraising campaign. We are **deeply grateful** to the **Foundation** for its **support** of this effort to **renovate** and **update** the **Planetarium**.

Fall 2007 Colloquium

The Fall 2007 Colloquium is scheduled for Thursday, August 30th, in the Fine Arts Theatre. This year's theme is "Writing Across the Curriculum: The Impact on Learning." Ms. Renata Engel, Associate Dean of Undergraduate Study in the Engineering Department at Pennsylvania State University, will be the keynote speaker at the Colloquium.

New **adjunct faculty** will be offered an **orientation program** in **late August**. That program is currently being developed.

<u>Enrollment</u>

<u>FY 2007 Enrollment</u> – The total number of **full-time equivalent students** for the **2006-2007 fiscal year** is **up 7.3%** over the last fiscal year, which is a **record high** for the college. The total **number of students**, **12,911**, who attended the College during **FY 2007**, is the **highest number** in **OCC's history**.

<u>Summer 2007</u> - For the first three summer terms, the **first five-week** session, the **ten-week** session, and the **twelve-week** session, the total **headcount is up 0.9%** and the total number of **credit hours is up 4.5%** as compared with last summer. **Registration** is still **ongoing** for the **remaining three summer terms**, the second five-week, the six-week, and the three-week post session. However, **preliminary data** shows that both **headcount** and **credits** have **increased** compared with last year at this point in time.

New Jersey Council of County Colleges

The New Jersey Council of County Colleges is sponsoring another trustee development presentation, *Board Leadership and Advocacy—A Winning Combination, A Conference for Community College Trustees, Foundation Board Members, and Presidents*, on Thursday, June 21st, at 4 p.m. at the Trenton Marriott at Lafayette Yard in Trenton. Dinner will follow at 5:30 p.m., and the Council will hold its business meeting at 6:30 p.m.

This special conference will feature a session by Dr. Noah Brown, President and CEO of the Association of Community College Trustees the national association representing community college trustees. Dr. Brown specializes in public policy, legislative advocacy, and strategic planning. Key legislators and representatives from the Governor's office will also attend the session.

I'm pleased that the Council has presented the opportunity for community college **trustees and Foundation members** to **join together** for this development seminar. I hope you will be able to attend.

Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program

Dr. L. Stanton Hales, Jr., is the new **Director of the Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program (BBNEP)**. Dr. Hales, who will **officially begin** his position on **Monday**, **July 2nd**, most recently served as a **Senior Fish and Wildlife Biologist** in the **New Jersey Field Office** of the **U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service**. Prior to that, Dr. Hales was the **Assistant Director** of the **Coastal Conservation Research Program** and **Visiting Assistant Professor of Biology and Marine Science Programs** at **Richard Stockton College**. His **research and teaching background** provide a **broad technical and administrative foundation** to support the Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program. His **main focus** after joining OCC will be the **implementation** of the Program's **Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan**.

On Sunday, June 3rd, the Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program sponsored the Barnegat Bay Festival in Island Heights. I want to acknowledge and commend the staff of the Program for their great work in organizing and managing the Festival, specifically Ms. Jeanine Cava, Public Outreach Coordinator, and Ms. Mary Judge, Program Assistant, who were quite instrumental in ensuring the festival's success. It was very well attended, informative, and enjoyable.

OCC Athletics

On June 4th, OCC's Scott Defibaugh captured the National Junior College Athletic Association Division III Gold Championship at Chautauqua Golf Club in Chautauqua, New York. Scott played rounds of 85, 84, 82, 80, for a four-day total of 331, which placed him among the 25 members of the Gold Team. Scott had qualified for the national championship by winning the Division III Region XIX Golf Championship at Cape May National Golf Club in May.

Communications Systems

The procedure accompanying Policy #2530, Administration, Communication Systems, Use of the Internet and Ocean County College Email, is currently being revised in light of recent college campus security concerns. The procedure will be comprehensive, offering information on individual employee responsibilities, acceptable use and restrictions, security priorities, and storage issues.

Ocean County College International Education

At Monday's meeting, Ms. Christine Kitchin, Assistant Professor of Anthropology, will report to the trustees on the OCC Native American Travel Seminar which she led to the Four Corners region of the American Southwest from May 12th through

May 21st. This educational seminar visited four states, Arizona, Utah, Colorado, and New Mexico, and several Indian Nations, including the Navajo, Zuni, Acoma Pueblo, and the Jicarrilla and White Mountain Apache reservations. Seminar participants also explored a variety of ancient Anasazi cliff dwellings and archaeological sites and participated in a "Gathering of Nations" on the Apache Reservation, which included traditional Native American music, dance, and singing competitions. Members of the travel seminar included OCC students, faculty, and community members.

Astronomy Class Offerings

Two new science courses are being recommended for approval at Monday's meeting, Physics 181, Astronomy I: The Solar System, and Physics 182, Astronomy II: Stars and Galaxies.

This expanded, two-semester astronomy course sequence will provide students with another alternative for satisfying OCC's laboratory science requirement. It will also allow recent exciting discoveries on the nature, origin, and evolution of the planets to be explored in much greater depth than in a one-semester course. The level and academic rigor will be similar to the algebra-based physics sequence, with a full complement of laboratory exercises in astronomy and optics. The Planetarium will also play an integral role in these courses when it is reopened.

In addition, an online version of the current one-semester astronomy course, SCIE 103, Introduction to Astronomy, is being developed, with the expectation that it will be offered in Spring 2008. This course will appeal to OCC students who need a one-semester science course or an elective, to science elementary and secondary teachers who want to enhance their knowledge with recent developments in astronomy, and to high school seniors and juniors who want a taste of college science prior to enrolling through the OCC Jump Start Program.

At Monday's meeting, Dr. James Brown, Dean of Science, Engineering, Allied Health, and Human Performance, will introduce Dr. Ken Garrison, Assistant Professor of Science, who developed the two new astronomy courses, and Mr. Rich Brady, Adjunct Instructor of Science, who is working on the online Astronomy offering.

Operation Enduring Freedom

Mr. Ron Bogota, Physical Plant, will briefly address the trustees at Monday's meeting to express his appreciation for their generosity in supporting our troops. Mr. Bogota used the donations collected at the last Board meeting for postage to mail care packages to the soldiers who are serving with his son, Army Specialist Dan Bogota, 1-4th Infantry Regiment, Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan.

Fine Arts Center

It had been anticipated that the Fine Arts Theatre would be dark this summer to prepare for the renovation of the building. However, when the facilities project was delayed, we were delighted when Ms. Bobbi Krantz, Director of the Fine Arts Center, was able to develop a full summer schedule on such short notice. Productions this summer include:

- The Heat is On! Saturday, July 14th, at 8:00 p.m. This critically acclaimed tourde-force performance will examine the life, loves, and career of one of Hollywood's most electrifying sirens and stars, **Rita Hayworth**.
- The Yates Musical Theatre's version of Pinocchio Thursday, July 19th, at 1:00 p.m. This musical story takes audiences from the puppet's creation by Gepetto, to his encounters with the fox and cat, along with his adventures in "Wonderfield in Owl Country" and "Playland."
- The Community Chorus of Ocean County College presents The Music of Cole Porter and George Gershwin - Saturday, July 21st, at 8:00 p.m. and Sunday, July 22nd, at 2:00 p.m. Hits will include "Anything Goes," "Night and Day," "I Love Paris," "I Got Rhythm," "Summertime," "Embraceable You," and many others.
- Xiayin Wang performs as part of the Fine Arts Center's Sunday Classics -Sunday, August 5th, at 2:00 p.m. A native of China, Xiayin Wang has garnered an enviable record of first prize awards throughout China. She commands an eclectic repertoire, ranging from Bach, Mozart, Beethoven, Chopin, and Liszt to later masters as Ravel and Rachmaninoff.
- The summer will bring hot Jazz back to Ocean County College when MidWeek Jazz returns on Wednesdays at 8:00 p.m. at the Fine Arts Center. MidWeek Jazz brings acclaimed artists playing classic jazz to the Jersey Shore:
 - **"Boogie Bob" Seeley** makes a **rare** East Coast **visit** on **June 20th**. Seeley is **acclaimed** around the world as the greatest **Boogie Woogie player** traveling to Europe, where he is popular with young people.
 - Robbie Scott's New Deal Orchestra takes the stage on July 11th. This premier Jazz and Swing band possesses both tight arrangements and accomplished musicians. The orchestra has played the White House, Tavern on the Green, and other NYC nightspots.
 - Dan Levinson's Palomar Quartet Returns on August 22nd with a tribute to Benny Goodman and the Swing Era. Clarinetist Dan Levinson captures the Goodman sound and has led sellout tributes in Manhattan and many cities in Europe.
