Foundation Gala

The Ocean County College Foundation Gala will be held on campus on Saturday evening, August 20th, at 5 p.m. This year's Gala is honoring Mr. David C. Wintrode as its Humanitarian of 2005. Mr. Joseph Coronoto is serving as the Chair of the Gala.

Mr. Wintrode is currently serving as Vice Chairman of the Foundation. He has been an avid supporter of the Foundation and the College during his 23 years of service, and it is fitting that he is being recognized for his contributions in time, effort, and resources.

As always, **proceeds** from the Summer Gala will support the continuing development of the **Foundation's scholarship fund**. Over the years, **thousands of deserving students** have **furthered their education** through financial assistance from the Foundation.

Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program

The 9th Annual Barnegat Bay Festival was held on Saturday, June 25th, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the college campus. The Festival, hosted by the Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program and the College, was also sponsored by the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, the Barnegat Bay Watershed and Estuary Foundation, Gangi Graphics, and the Ocean County Utilities Authority. It featured booths and activities for adults and children, and free guidance documents and fact sheets were available.

The Barnegat Bay Watershed and Estuary Foundation, Inc., is a not-for-profit organization that was established in Ocean County during the early 1990's, originally as the Barnegat Bay Watershed Association. The mission of the Foundation is to promote a healthy ecosystem throughout the Barnegat Bay Watershed. The Foundation accomplishes this through conducting educational seminars, distributing information at various fairs and festivals, and producing and distributing its newsletter.

The Foundation is sponsoring a demonstration garden on campus that will be situated at the intersection of College Drive and Buckwald Drive. The purpose of the demonstration garden is to create an area that will demonstrate the types of plants, grasses, shrubs, and small trees that can be used in the watershed to minimize, or eliminate, the uses of herbicides and pesticides. The garden area will also illustrate that an attractive area can be established using low maintenance and low water consumptive plant material. The garden will contain signage indicating the plants and grasses being utilized and the ways in which it fits into the natural Pine Barrens landscape. Upon completion of the project, information will be distributed to the public at libraries and other public facilities to encourage people to visit the garden at Ocean County College. The funding for this project was made possible through the generous support of The William Penn Foundation, which is administered by The Conservation Fund.

Mr. Rich Bizub, a representative from the Foundation, will be at Monday's Board meeting to make a brief presentation on the demonstration garden. Accompanying him will be Ms. Shannon Shinault, Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program Outreach Coordinator.

Kean University Partnership

The college is extremely enthusiastic about extending its partnership with Kean University. For the past five years, Kean has successfully offered graduate courses in education on our campus. Courses for completion of the nursing degree have recently been offered. We are now formalizing an agreement to expand Kean's offerings at OCC to include both undergraduate and graduate degree completion in several other programs.

This week, the university's board of trustees approved expending the funds to finance the renovation of three classrooms in our Instructional Building that will be dedicated for Kean's use. Although the renovations will take several months to complete, Kean will have exclusive use of a classroom beginning in the fall semester.

Ultimately, our **mutual goal** is for Kean University to **construct a building** on OCC's campus to provide the opportunity for Ocean County residents to **complete upper-level courses** here in Toms River.

Travel Abroad

The **OCC International Education Program** is planning the following trips:

♦ The very popular and successful Theatre in London Seminar is scheduled for January 4th to 16th. Participants will have the opportunity to see and discuss 10 to 12 plays, from the experimental Fringe to the major plays of the Royal National Theatre, the Royal Shakespeare Company, and the West End. Also included will be trips to Stratford-Upon-Avon and Maritime Greenwich. The seminar leader is

Mr. Arthur Waldman, Professor of Humanities, who is in his 27th year as the leader of this trip. Ably assisting him for the 20th year is Dr. Judith Icklan, Vice President of Economic and Workforce Development.

◆ Travel to Mexico is being offered through the World of the Maya: Archaeology, Anthropology, and Ecology, from January 6th to 17th. Participants will study the Maya people, their archaeology, and culture, as well as the tropical ecology in the Yucatan region. Also being visited are several Spanish colonial towns, a traditional Maya village, and the ruins of the ancient cities of Chichen Itza, Uxmal, Tulum, and Ed'Balam. Ms. Christine Kitchin, Assistant Professor of Social Sciences, is the leader of this offering.

Of particular interest is that the **OCC Foundation** is supporting the International Education Program through the availability of **12 scholarships** for **OCC students** who register for the trip to Mexico.

In addition, the OCC Academy for Lifelong Learning is sponsoring travel to Germany from December 3rd to 10th. This trip will feature a Bavaria Arts and Crafts Christmas Market tour. Munich's Christmas market, or Christkindlmarkt, dates back to the 14th Century and offers a fascinating array of decorations, craftwork, candles, toys, and culinary delights. Also included in this trip are tours of Munich, Rothenburg, Nuerenberg, the Medieval Crime Museum, and Prince Ludwig's "Neuschweinstein" castle.

Israel Institute for University Presidents

I am very excited about my upcoming trip to Israel from July 10th to 18th as a participant in the Israel Institute for University Presidents sponsored by the Jewish Federation of Ocean County, the United Jewish Communities, and the Jewish Council for Public Affairs. The Institute will focus on Israel's reality on the ground, the prospects for peace between Israelis and Palestinians, issues related to higher education, and exploring long-term relationships with educational institutions in Israel. I am particularly looking forward to meeting with the President of the University of Haifa and other Israeli college presidents to discuss possible exchange partnerships.

Others who will be participating in this Institute include presidents from Kean University, Old Dominion University, Manchester Community College, Muhlenberg College, Swarthmore College, the University of Bellarmine, and Wheelock College, as well as several representatives from the sponsoring organizations.

Visiting Professor

I have invited Ms. Wei Zhang, Associate Professor at Xi'an International Studies University in China, to be a Visiting Professor at OCC during the 2005-2006 academic year. Professor Zhang will teach two courses each semester in our Business and English departments and will be given the opportunity to attend two OCC courses. She

will also be able to participate in various college social, cultural, and professional development opportunities.

Ms. Zhang has a **visa**, and we are currently attempting to **assist her** in obtaining the other **necessary approvals** for travel to the United States. This process may take somewhat **longer than anticipated**, but, hopefully, she will be here for the **fall semester**.

This **educational exchange** with Xi'an University is an **innovative** and **exciting** program. **Professor Karl Kleiner**, a member of our **Business faculty**, has been **teaching in China** during the past **spring semester** and is expected to return the beginning of July. His communications have expressed a **deep appreciation** for this opportunity, which he found to be **fascinating**, **rewarding**, and **challenging**. I will ask Professor Kleiner to join us at a future Board meeting to share his experiences.

Employee Recognition

Dr. Frank Wetta has been invited by the Institute on Quality Enhancement and Accreditation, which is sponsored by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and the Association of American Colleges and Universities to participate on a panel discussion at its Summer Institute in Orlando, Florida, from July 24th to 27th. This three-day conference will highlight quality enhancement initiatives that focus on student learning and the academic environment. The panel will discuss, among other items, the OCC Academic Master Plan, which will receive wide exposure at this well attended conference.
