## Governor Chris Christie's Proposed FY 2013 Budget

On Tuesday, February 21<sup>st</sup>, Governor Chris Christie proposed a \$32.15 billion FY 2013 State budget that calls for an increase in funds for higher education. This increase follows two years of flat or decreased funding. The FY 2013 budget:

- ♦ Expands Opportunities for Students with \$393.2 Million in Financial Assistance Governor Christie's budget increases financial support for New Jersey students attending in-state institutions to an all-time high. More than \$393.2 million is recommended for the various programs that make up the State's student financial assistance package.
- ♦ Increases Funding by \$37.5 Million for the Neediest Students through Tuition Aid Grants (TAG) \$341.4 million in State funding is provided in total for TAG programs. This level of support will allow the average award in each sector to increase. Additionally, the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA) will align its regulations with those of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) regarding family size.
- ♦ Increases Funding for the New Jersey Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) for the First Time in Four Years More than \$38.8 million is provided for annual EOF grants ranging from \$200 to \$2,500 to the economically and educationally disadvantaged students who need it most. EOF grants assist low income residents who are capable and motivated but lack adequate preparation for college study.
- ♦ Continues NJ STARS Funding The budget continues funding for this State-sponsored, meritbased NJ STARS scholarship program designed to reward academic excellence to outstanding high school graduates. Mr. Dave Wolfe, Special Assistant to the President and 10<sup>th</sup> District Assemblyman, and I devised a revision to the program, which has the full support of the

Governor, the Legislature, and all segments of New Jersey higher education. Effective in fall 2012, the revisions to the program for new NJ STARS recipients are:

- ♦ NJ STARS scholarships will cover only tuition costs.
- ♦ NJ STARS II students may use the scholarship to attend New Jersey independent four-year institutions of higher education as well as public institutions.
- ♦ The NJ STARS II scholarship will no longer be calculated on the student's grade point average.
- ◆ The **cost** of the **NJ STARS II scholarships** will be paid by the **State**.
- ♦ Community colleges are encouraged to provide four-year institutions with the opportunity to recruit NJ STARS I students.

#### **Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA)**

Governor Christie, on Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup>, filed nominations with the State Senate for various State Board appointments. He has nominated me as the County College Representative on the Board of the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA). The nomination is subject to the advice and consent of the State Senate.

HESAA delivers millions of dollars in financial aid annually; since its inception in 1959, it has delivered over \$18 billion in financial aid. HESAA administers the Tuition Aid Grant (TAG), the Part-Time TAG for County College Students, NJ STARS I and II, the Garden State Scholars programs, the Federal Family Education Loan program, NJ CLASS, and NJ BEST. HESAA also offers financial literacy programs for young adults, training programs for guidance counselors, and outreach programs across the State to ensure that students and families gain valuable information about the availability and affordability of higher education. HESAA is a co-sponsor of College Goal Sunday, which was held on our campus on Sunday, February 26<sup>th</sup>.

### Ocean County College Board of School Estimate

The Ocean County College FY 2013 budget will be presented for approval at the Ocean County College Board of School Estimate meeting, which is scheduled for Wednesday, March 7<sup>th</sup>, at the Ocean County Administration Building. The Board is comprised of three freeholders and two trustees. This year's Board of School Estimate members are Freeholders John C. Bartlett, Jr., James F. Lacey, and Gerry P. Little and Board Chair Van Thulin and Board Treasurer Jerry Dasti. Board Secretary Stephan Leone serves as the Secretary of the Board of School Estimate.

#### **Ocean County College Website**

The Ocean County College website, <a href="www.ocean.edu">www.ocean.edu</a>, is updated and improved continuously by Ms. Maureen Conlon, Manager of Web Services, and individual departments of the College. Ms. Tara Kelly, Vice President of College Advancement, will make a brief presentation on the Ocean County College website at Monday's meeting.

Some of the **new** and **revised content** includes:

- ♦ Online Admissions Application (<a href="www.apply.ocean.edu">www.apply.ocean.edu</a>) The new online admissions application allows a prospective student to create an individual account with a user name and password and then to complete and submit the application directly to the Registration Office. The student is assured that the personal information submitted is encrypted and secure. Links are included for College resources that may be of interest to a prospective student.
- ♦ Ocean County College E-Learning (www.online.ocean.edu) This new micro-site provides a separate and distinct web presence for individuals who are interested in pursuing their education through distance learning. The site welcomes the students, provides guidance on the application process, highlights distance learning courses and degrees programs, delineates tuition and fees, and provides links to the course schedule, e-advising, the Library, and the 24/7 Help Desk for assistance in the event problems are encountered. From a marketing perspective, this micro-site displays various messages to engage potential students from throughout the country and includes interactive features, such as video, image gallery, and rotating degree spotlights. The site also collects information from individuals who want to learn more about distance learning at Ocean County College before applying; a return telephone call is made to the prospective student within 24 hours after a request is made.
- ♦ Ocean County College Purchasing (www.purchasing.ocean.edu) After several years, the Purchasing Department recently completed the development of a specialized portal for both College employees and prospective vendors. It includes the names of Purchasing Department employees, current bid opportunities, vendor forms, previous contract awards, and policies and procedures for purchases.
- ◆ Ocean County College Human Resources (<a href="www.career.ocean.edu">www.career.ocean.edu</a>) Also prominently displayed on the College's home page is a link for individuals who are interested in applying for employment. This unique sub-domain allows interested people to search for position openings, provides an application to be completed online and submitted to the Human Resources Department, and lets individuals manage their application for six months for possible resubmission. Additionally, current employees have HR information available to them through OceanCruiser.

- ◆ Ocean County College Theatre (<u>www.tickets.ocean.edu</u>) All tickets for Theatre performances may now be purchased on the College website. Patrons no longer need to travel to the College for their tickets. They can view details of events, which are categorized by genre, create personal accounts for future use, and purchase their tickets using a credit card.
- ◆ Ocean County College Planetarium (<u>www.ocean.edu/planet.htm</u>) The Robert J. Novins Planetarium site provides extensive information on a variety of programs for students and the community-at-large:
  - ♦ The schedule of ongoing public shows with descriptions and ticket prices
  - ◆ A listing of special events, such as Pajama Nights and the popular Laser Shows
  - ♦ Public school programs for students from pre-kindergarten to high school
  - ♦ Academic **Astronomy courses**
  - ♦ Information on ASTRA, the Astronomical Society of the Toms River Area
  - ♦ A link to "Universe Today," which contains space and astronomy news

All of these **revisions** and **additions** to the **College website** have resulted in not only **ease of use** by **students** and **visitors** but also in **more efficient operations** and **effective fiscal management** through **significant savings**. Many **more improvements** and **enhancements** are **scheduled** and **ongoing**.
