39th Annual Commencement Week Activities

Eric is graduating with a **4.0 grade point average** and will be continuing toward his **bachelor's degree** at **Rutgers University**. Eric is a **NJ STARS student**, who began his courses at OCC as a **senior** in **high school**, graduating in 2005.

In addition, **Dr. Dawood Farahi**, **President of Kean University**, will attend commencement, and I will present him with a **plaque** in **acknowledgment** of our **partnership**.

Ocean County College Foundation

- ◆ Golf Outing The 5th Annual OCC Foundation Golf Outing took place at the Sea Oaks Golf Club in Little Egg Harbor on Monday, May 1st. We had approximately 130 golfers and raised almost \$73,000 to support student scholarships and special projects. NJ STARS Program

I am very pleased to inform you that Ocean County College has the highest number of graduating NJ STARS students in the state this year. The New Jersey Council of County Colleges compiled data from the nineteen community colleges, and it reported that OCC has 43 NJ STARS graduates, with Gloucester County College second at 24 graduates, and Brookdale Community College third with 21.

Since then, **another 3** OCC NJ STARS students have applied for graduation, bringing the **total to 46**.

The success of our NJ STARS program is the result of a collaborative **effort** since the inception of the program two years ago. Under the leadership of Provost Dan Duffy, with the assistance of Mr. Don Doran, Acting Vice President of Student Affairs, and Ms. Laura Rickards, Director of the Educational Opportunity Fund, a NJ **STARS** Advisory Board established, was which representatives from the local high schools as well as the New Jersey Higher Education Student Assistance Authority. members of the Advisory Board and OCC staff have done an **exemplary job** of **strengthening** the process for the **recruitment** and **retention** of NJ STARS students.

This June, over **1,300 graduating high school seniors** are **eligible** for the NJ STARS Program. We are **actively recruiting** these students and anticipate many of them **choosing OCC** for their higher education.

Phi Theta Kappa

I have invited Mr. Michael Mayo, outgoing President of OCC's Tau Iota Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, to make a brief presentation at Monday's meeting. He will introduce to you President-Elect Susan Taylor, will report on the highlights of his presidency, and brief you on our trip to Seattle, Washington, in April for Phi Theta Kappa's annual convention, during which I was presented with a 2006 Shirley B. Gordon Award of Distinction.

On May 4th, I attended the 12th annual Phi Theta Kappa Day celebration in Trenton. Each year, the New Jersey Council of County Colleges hosts a luncheon program to recognize the members of the New Jersey All-State Academic Team, which is sponsored by Phi Theta Kappa, for their outstanding academic achievement and exceptional service to their communities as members of PTK at their local community colleges.

This year, **Donald Burke** and **Eric Weinberg** were named to the **All-State Academic Team**, both of whom have certainly earned this honor. Additionally, **Donald Burke**, **Eric Weinberg**, and **Adam Geib** have each been awarded a **Rutgers University Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society Scholarship** for the **fall 2006 semester**.

<u>Planetarium</u>

At Monday's meeting, **Dr. Judy Icklan** and **Ms. Gloria Villalobos**, **Director of the Planetarium**, will **update** you on the **Planetarium**. In response to the pledge from an **anonymous donor** to support the renovation of the Planetarium, a **Request for Proposals** was developed to seek **consulting services** to address the **goal** of **utilizing advanced technology** in a modern facility suitable for **multiple uses** by the college and community. The **key element** of this RFP is a **cost estimate for consulting services** on Planetarium **equipment**, **theatre renovation** for a multi-use facility, **staffing requirements**, and an analysis of the Planetarium's **operating costs** based on the implementation of recommendations. The **RFP's** are due on **May 19th**.

Campus Civility

At my request, Ms. Janet Hubbs, Assistant to the President for Institutional Effectiveness, established a Process Improvement Team on Campus Civility for the purpose of reviewing concerns about the campus climate, identifying problems, and making recommendations for improvement. In addition to Ms. Hubbs, the team has twelve other members who represent various constituencies of the college.
