Mr. Jack Lamping

The recent passing of Mr. Jack Lamping on October 23rd is a great loss to Ocean County College and to Ocean County. Mr. Lamping has been a tireless supporter of the College and its Foundation, having served as a Foundation member from 1976 until his retirement in 2005, at which time he was designated as a *Trustee Emeritus*.

Mr. Lamping received the Ocean County College Distinguished Service Award in 1988. In 1998, he was honored as the Ocean County College Foundation Humanitarian of the Year. These awards were well deserved; there was nothing he would not do to advance the mission of the College and Foundation.

Mr. Lamping, a long-time resident of Ocean County, was known as "Mr. Ocean County" by many, for good reason. He served as Director of Ocean County Public Information for 35 years and was vice president of a local bank for many years. More importantly, Mr. Lamping was dedicated to community service, working on behalf of the Ocean County Historical Society, the New Jersey Council of Tourism, the Toms River Student Loan Fund, the Salvation Army, the United Way of Ocean County, the Ocean County Council of Boy Scouts of America, the Monmouth-Ocean Development Council, the Monmouth-Ocean Conference for Community and Justice, and the First United Methodist Church of Toms River. His efforts on behalf of Ocean County residents were without comparison.

When I assumed the presidency of Ocean County College in 2000, Mr. Lamping was among the first to welcome me. He devoted several days driving me throughout Ocean County to introduce me to business and community leaders and to acquaint me with the area. I will truly miss his friendship and positive spirit, as will so many others both in and out of Ocean County.



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Ocean County College Athletics Program

I am very **pleased** to inform you of the wonderful **success** of the **Ocean County College Athletics Program** this fall:

- ◆ The Athletics Department of Ocean County College is the first recipient of the Region XIX Champions of Character Award. The new award recognizes a Region XIX Athletics Department that exhibits outstanding results in character development of its student-athletes and coaches by embracing the true spirit of competition through five core values of respect, integrity, responsibility, servant leadership, and sportsmanship. The award recipient also demonstrates outstanding involvement in the community, which results in positive character development through sports.
- ♦ The Collegiate Athletic Administrators of New Jersey (CCANJ) presents Scholar Athlete of the Year Awards to one male and one female student from New Jersey colleges in each athletic division. The award recognizes a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher, academic achievement, athletic achievement, and campus/community involvement. For the first time, both winners are Ocean County College students.

Ashley Bechtle, the Female Scholar Athlete of the Year, was a standout women's soccer athlete. Her excellence in the classroom earned her cum laude honors, recognition as a National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Academic All-American, and membership in Phi Theta Kappa. As a NJ STARS student, Ashley was selected to speak to the New Jersey Legislature about the NJ STARS program.

Ashley was also named a member of the Garden State Athletic Conference Team in 2007 and the 2008 NJCAA Soccer All-American and All-Region Teams. At the National Championships, Ashley was named a member of the All-Tournament Team. She graduated in May and is currently attending Rutgers University.

Mr. Stephen Kennelly was honored as the Male Scholar Athlete of the Year. Steve excelled in the classroom and on the golf course, earning summa cum laude honors as well as being named as an NJCAA Distinguished Academic All-American. He led the golf team to the Nationals in 2008 and finished 35th in the country in 2009. Steve was selected as the #1 golfer in Region XIX.

Steve was also a NJ STARS student and a member of Phi Theta Kappa. He graduated in May with a 4.0 grade point average and is now attending Montclair State University.



Two Ocean County College student-athletes were announced on October 14th as Players of the Week by the NJCAA:

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- Ms. Kristina Laureigh was named as Player of the Week for NJCAA Division III Women's Soccer. Kristina, the sophomore team captain, led the defensive effort for the College last week, allowing only two shots on goal over three games. Ocean County College Women's Soccer is ranked #3 in the NJCAA Division III National Soccer Poll, with a record of 11-2-1.
- Ms. Jennifer Nelson was named Runner of the Week for NJCAA Division III Women's Cross Country. This recognition is based on her performance in the Monmouth Invitational 5K race with a time of **19:51**, the team's **first place finish** at the event, and her **excellent season**. Ocean County College Women's Cross Country is currently ranked #1 in the NJCAA Division III **National Poll**, and **Jennifer** is recognized as one of the **top runners** in the **nation**.
- Both the Men's and Women's Soccer teams have played well enough this season to reach the Semi-Finals of the Region XIX Tournament. The men's team is playing the County College of Morris, and the women are competing against Brookdale Community College. Because of the rain this week, the **games** have been **postponed**.
- The Women's Cross Country team won the Region XIX Tournament and is ranked #1 in the ۲ country. The team will play in the NJCAA National Tournament on November 7th at Finger Lakes Community College in New York.

Needless to say, the Ocean County College Athletics Program is becoming one of the best in the nation. We owe that, in large measure, to the dedication and commitment of Ms. Ilene Cohen, Director of Athletics, Mr. AJ Trump, Assistant Director of Athletics, and all of our team coaches for providing such effective, enthusiastic, and excellent leadership to our student-athletes.

Ocean County College Sailing Program

The performance of the Ocean County College Sailing Team continues to be very impressive. The **OCC team** has been quite successful sailing against upper division varsity teams, such as the U.S. Naval Academy, Princeton University, the University of Delaware, the University of Pennsylvania, Cornell University, Monmouth University, Penn State University, Drexel University, the University of Maryland at Baltimore County, St. Mary's College, Villanova University, Christopher Newport University, Queens University, Washington College, Fordham University, Columbia University, and Loyola College.



On September 20th, the team qualified for the Middle Atlantic Intercollegiate Sailing Association (MAISA) fall regatta. Eighteen colleges participated as OCC hosted the event on the Toms River.

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- Our team finished second in the COHO Memorial regatta held at Webb Institute on Long Island on September 26th and 27th.
- On October 3rd and 4th, the team completed the Philly Fleet race in second place, with OCC's Tyler Kennedy and Autumn Hoover winning the A Division on the Delaware River.
- OCC triumphed at the University of Delaware McCurdy regatta on October 10th and 11th. Again. Tyler and Autumn won the A Division.
- For the third time, Tyler and Autumn won the A Division as OCC finished fourth at the Washington College regatta in Maryland. Eighteen colleges competed on October 17th and 18th.
- And for the **fourth time**, Tyler and Autumn won the A Division, with Brad Wright and Emily McCarthy winning the B Division, at the Nittany Lion Open at Penn State University on October 25^{th} .

This weekend, the Sailing Team travels to St. Mary's College in Maryland to compete in the MAISA Championships.

Ocean County College Chemistry Club

October 18th through 24th was National Chemistry Week, an annual event to raise public awareness of the **importance** of **chemistry** in **everyday life**. The week is **coordinated** by the **American Chemical** Society and was first celebrated in 1987. This year's theme was "Chemistry—It's Elemental!" to celebrate the 140th anniversary of the Periodic Table of elements.

For National Chemistry Week, the Ocean County College Chemistry Club hosted a community outreach program that demonstrated hands-on chemistry experiments. Collaborating in this effort were Professor Maria Tamburro, who serves as Club Advisor, Science Professors Dr. Pat Demko and Dr. Marcia Bradley, Adjunct Professor of Science Bob Artz, Georgian Court University faculty member Dr. Andrew Weber, Georgian Court University students, and members of the Chemistry Club.

In addition, the Ocean County College Chemistry Club has responded to a challenge by the President of the American Chemical Society to produce a video to educate and promote chemistry in our community based on the theme "I am a Proud Chemist because..." Featured in the video are



professionals from various disciplines, including Dr. Bradley, Dr. Jim Brown, Professor Marc Labella, and Professor Tamburro. Club President Erine O'Connor and club members Joshua Price, Ellen Miller, Daniel Schnell, and Jim Gilroy worked with our talented media department in making this video. The video will be entered in the American Chemical Society's competition. I have asked Professor Tamburro and club members to attend the Board meeting to share their video with you.

The Chemistry Club will also be involved with other projects this year: It will continue its efforts with **Dr. William Rickert, Professor of Mathematics and Advisor to Phi Theta Kappa,** and **Phi Theta Kappa members** in the completion of the **Rain Garden**, which is located by our recently renovated **Arts and Community Center**. In addition, the group will continue to **raise funds** for a **St. Jude's Children special charity** as well as **collect non-perishable items** for Ocean County's **St. Vincent DePaul's Food Pantry** this **holiday season**.

Center for Academic Excellence

The mission of the Center for Academic Excellence (CAE) is to promote equity and excellence in the educational opportunities for Ocean County College students. The key functions of the CAE include the leadership and coordination of the Student Success course for first year students, testing services, tutoring and mentoring activities, NJ STARS enrichment services, disability services, regional center activities, and an orientation program with new and untenured faculty. Key factors in the success of CAE initiatives are: administrative and faculty support; student-staff contacts characterized by staff accessibility, expertise, and commitment; and program comprehensiveness.

The Center for Academic Excellence is receiving financial support through two grants awarded to Ocean County College for the 2009-2010 academic year:

- ◆ Edge Foundation Grant Based on OCC's national reputation for services for students with disabilities, Ocean County College has been selected as one of six colleges, with Northeastern University, George Washington University, University of Michigan, and Washington State University, to receive this grant. The purpose of the grant is to quantify the effectiveness of personal coaching strategies on the academic, professional, and social achievements of students with ADHD in college and university settings. Students who are selected to participate in this grant will receive free coaching for the entire year by a highly trained Edge coach. The cost for coaching each student would normally cost a minimum of \$3,000.
- ♦ PASS Grant The Project Academic Skills Support (PASS) grant funds the support services for college students with learning disabilities. Ocean County College will receive \$162,000 annually for the next five years from the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education to continue to serve as a comprehensive support program for these students. OCC is the recipient of the largest of the awards to the five colleges in New Jersey. The program continues to focus on transition,



orientation, academic support, diagnostic services, technical training, and professional development for faculty and staff at OCC and other New Jersey colleges.

I have invited Ms. Maureen Reustle, Dean of Academic Services, to Monday's meeting to share additional information regarding the activities of the Center for Academic Excellence.

GED Testing

The New Jersey Department of Education has renewed its contract for Ocean County College to serve as a site for the testing of General Education Development (GED). Last year, the College served the community's need for an alternate route to a high school diploma in two ways, through the GED test administered in our Testing Center and through application to the State for the 30 college credit route.

Ocean County College ranks third, out of 13 county colleges that offer the GED test, in numbers of students tested and awarded high school diplomas. More impressive is the fact that OCC's passing rate continues to remain among the highest in the State at 77.8 percent in 2008.

Ms. Carol Cappetta, OCC'S GED Chief Examiner, reports that there has been a substantial increase in the number of students taking the GED test at the College since the inception of the program:

It must be noted that the event would not be possible without the financial support of Ms. Kathleen Chinery-DeVito who continues to support the event in memory of her husband, Mr. Scott Chinery.

This year's **Harvest Party** was, unfortunately, affected by the **bad weather**, which necessitated **moving** the **activities**, which are typically located outdoors on the onion field, into the **Gymnasium**. Mr. Muska is now enrolled in the Kean-Ocean program, working toward his baccalaureate degree in business management. He
