April Board of Trustees Meeting

Please note that we are scheduling the **April meeting** of the Board of Trustees on **Wednesday**, **April 26**th because of conflicts in my schedule. If you are unable to be with us on April 26th, please let me know.

Fulbright Scholar-in-Residence

I am delighted to inform you that the **Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs**, **United States Department of State**, has **confirmed funding** for the OCC proposal for a **Scholar-in-Residence** under the **2006-2007 Fulbright Program** and that the Fulbright Scholarship Board has approved the proposal.

Dr. Abou-Youssef will be visiting OCC for **nine months**, from **September 1, 2006**. An **Associate Professor** in the **College of Mass Communications** at **Cairo University**, she is a dynamic and respected **teacher**, **researcher**, **and scholar** in the field of **communication studies** at **Cairo University**.

Dr. Abou-Youssef will serve as a **guest lecturer** in several academic courses related to her areas of **expertise**, such as **Arabic literature** and **world literature**, **women in journalism**, the nature of **press freedom** in different parts of the world, and the ways that **gender**, **class**, **and ethnic issues** affect other societies.

Dr. Inas Abou-Youssef earned a **Ph.D.** from **Cairo University** with a **dissertation** involving **East-West cultural relations**. We are honored that she will be visiting OCC as a Scholar-in-Residence.

Articulation Agreement

Ocean County College and the United States Sports Academy (USSA), Daphne, Alabama, have entered into an articulation agreement for qualified OCC students to pursue a Bachelor of

Science degree in Sport Coaching and Sport Management. USSA is a special mission institution of higher learning accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Mr. Michael Klecan, Instructor of Health and Human Performance and Part-time Athletic Trainer, is working with USSA to provide local internship opportunities with organizations such as the Ocean County YMCA and the Lakewood Blue Claws.

Council of County Colleges Trustee Seminar

Holocaust Remembrance Day

The Ocean County College Center for Peace, Genocide, and Holocaust Studies will hold a lecture and candle lighting ceremony in recognition of Holocaust Remembrance Day on Monday, April 24th, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Fine Arts Center. The event is free and open to the public.

Ms. Judith H. Sherman, Monroe Township, will lecture on **Resistance in a Choice-Less Universe**. Ms. Sherman is the **author** of the book *Say the Name: A Survivor's Tale in Prose and Poetry*, which recounts her **experiences as a child** during the **Holocaust**.

Following the lecture, a **candle lighting ceremony** with **Holocaust survivors** will be led by **Rabbi Lee Paskind**, **Congregation Ahavat Shalom**, Lakewood. The second half of the program will include a presentation by **Dr. Ali Botein-Furrevig**, **OCC Adjunct Assistant Professor English**, entitled **Bearing Witness: the Music of the Children of Terezin**. The program will feature **musical recordings** based on **poems written by children** imprisoned at **Terezin concentration campus** in Czechoslovakia.

Holocaust Remembrance Day concludes with Dr. Marilyn Kralik, OCC Professor of Fine Arts presenting a Reflection on the Display of Flags. Flags of different colors representing the eleven million victims who perished in the Holocaust will be displayed on a field adjacent to the OCC College Center.

It is **respectfully requested** that the Board of Trustees **adopt a resolution** in recognition of the **importance** of **Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust** with the hope that all will aggressively strive to **overcome and resist prejudice** and **inhumanity** through **education**, **vigilance**, **and resistance**.

Phi Theta Kappa

Two OCC students, Eric Weinberg and Donald Burke, have been named by the New Jersey Council of County Colleges to the 2006 New Jersey All-State Academic Team and are being recognized for their outstanding academic achievements and exceptional service to their communities as members of Phi Theta Kappa.

The students have been invited to be guests of honor, with 35 other exceptional students from throughout the state, at a special program on Thursday, May 4th, at the Lafayette Yard Marriott Hotel in Trenton. Representatives from the Governor's Office and the State Legislature will attend the program and join in honoring the students' accomplishments.

It is noted that **last year**, our own **Amy Farina** was one of two students from OCC selected for the **All-State Academic Team**.
