## **Enrollment Highlights**

#### **♦** Fall 2008

OCC has set a **record** with the **highest number** of **students** enrolled and **total credit hours** for **fall 2008**. The total fall **headcount** is **9,811**, representing an **increase** of **4.9 percent** over last fall semester. The **total credits** are **100,842**, a **7.6 percent increase** over last fall semester.

Ethnicity – A total of 1,380 minority students enrolled this fall, representing 14.1 percent of the students and an 11.0 percent increase over last fall. The total number of Hispanic students, 723, also sets a record with an 8.9 percent increase over last fall, while Asian students increased 11.4 percent and African-American students increased 9.0 percent over last fall semester.

Gender – About 41.6 percent of the students are male and 58.4 percent are female. This proportion has remained relatively the same over the last decade.

Age – With the increasing number of full-time students, the overall average age has been declining over the last decade from 26.2 to 23.2. For the fall 2008 semester, the average age for female students is 24.3 and for male students is 21.8. The youngest student is 15 years, and the oldest is 81.

#### ♦ **Summer 2008**

Compared with summer 2007, the total headcount is up 6.6 percent (4,588) for 2008 summer terms, and the total number of credits is up 5.3 percent.

Mr. Chengbo Yin, Director of Research and Assessment, will provide a brief report at Monday's meeting on the highlights of our increasing enrollment.

### **Governor's Panel on NJ STARS**

The final meeting of the **Panel** appointed by **Governor Corzine** to address **improvements** needed in the **NJ STARS law** with the goals of **saving taxpayer funds**, **strengthening** the **academic requirements** for STARS eligibility, and **correcting** several **oversights** in how the law affects certain students will be held at the **State House** in **Trenton** on **Monday**, **September 22**<sup>nd</sup>, at **3:00 p.m.** 

Assemblyman David Wolfe and I are members of this Panel, which also includes representatives from the senior public universities, the Executive branch, and members of the New Jersey Senate and General Assembly. After numerous meetings among the higher education sector representatives and two public hearings, the Panel will seek to find agreement on a final proposal to present to Governor Corzine. I am hopeful and optimistic that the proposal will offer solutions to the issues the Panel was charged to address that will result in continuation of both the NJ STARS I and II programs, which have been of great benefit to New Jersey's community colleges and their STARS students.

#### Ocean County College Foundation Gala

Due to the impending threat of Hurricane Hanna hitting the Jersey Shore, the OCC Foundation Beach Party Gala was moved to the Poland Spring Arena at the Ritacco Center on Saturday, September 6<sup>th</sup>. Despite the need to make this change in venue, the Gala was again very successful. Approximately 300 people ventured out in the rain and wind to enjoy good food and good company for a good cause as the Foundation honored the OceanFirst Foundation as the 2008 Humanitarian of the Year. Over \$200,000 was raised to support the mission of the Foundation.

Special acknowledgment is due to Tara Kelly, Jan Kirsten, Sandy Broughton, and the Physical Plant staff who worked extraordinary hours to make this short-notice transition the great success that it was. The Advancing the Status of Women Award honors businesses, organizations, and other enterprises that have served to advance the status of women and have promoted recognition of women's issues. Ocean County College is being honored for efforts to create programs that enable women to further their education while raising families, promote women to administrative levels, and employ a staff that is 57% female.

### Ocean County Silent Witness Program

Ocean County College has been invited to host the Ocean County Silent Witness Project, an event to commemorate county residents who have been murdered through acts of domestic violence. This program is being presented in honor of National Domestic Violence Awareness Month in cooperation with Providence House Domestic Violence Services of Catholic Charities, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, Berkeley Police Department, and Soroptimist International of Toms River.

The Silent Witness Project uses life size figures to represent domestic violence murder victims. This program began in 1990, and these memorials have spread throughout counties and states across the country. This is the first time such a program will be held in Ocean County.

The event is scheduled for Friday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, at 10:00 a.m. on the campus mall. A reception will follow in the Solar Lounge.
