The Ocean County College Foundation

The Ocean County College Foundation's annual Summer Gala, held on campus on Saturday, August 20th, was extremely successful, raising over \$300,000 for its scholarship fund. The live and silent auctions raised over \$32,000.

The Alumni Association is sponsoring its Campus 5K Run and Fitness Walk on Sunday, November 6th. Registration will begin at 9:00 a.m., with the event starting at 10:00 a.m. This United States of America Track and Field sanctioned event, with a certified course, takes place on the OCC campus and includes mile splits and water stops. Proceeds from the event will benefit the students of OCC.

5K awards will be presented to the **top three male and female overall winners** as well as the **top OCC alumnus and alumna**. Awards also will be given to the **top three males and females** in each **age group**: 14 and under, 15-19, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, and 70 plus.

NJ STARS Program

At OCC, there were 130 NJ STARS students during the fall 2004 semester. Of those 130, 100 are continuing here at OCC. Additionally, 8 students began the spring 2005 semester in the program and are continuing here.

As of September 20th, there are 121 new students this fall semester who have applied for the NJ STARS Program, bringing the total number of eligible NJ STARS students at OCC to 229. The students have until October 1st to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine if they are eligible for financial aid, which will influence the total number of students in the NJ STARS Program at OCC.

International Education Activities

♦ CCIS German Programs: Self-Study and Program Review — The collegesponsored semester programs in Germany recently completed a self-study and review process by the parent organization, the College Consortium for International Studies (CCIS). It was recommended by both the paper and on-site reviewers that CCIS continue to offer both the Intensive German Language and Business/Liberal Arts programs.

- ◆ Faculty Exchange Program with Xi'an International Studies University Following Associate Professor Karl Kleiner's successful visiting professor experience at Xi'an International Studies University in China this past spring semester, we are working with Kean University to bring Professor Wei Zhang from Xi'an to OCC in 2006. Professor Zhang has been offered a temporary appointment as a Visiting Professor in the Business Studies and English Departments from January 1st to December 31st.

I have asked **Professor Kleiner** to attend Monday's meeting to provide you with a **brief report** on his **experiences in China**.

- ♦ Russian Medical Professionals to Visit OCC The International Education Office is coordinating a reception for medical professionals from Russia to network with OCC business faculty and allied health staff on Tuesday, October 4th, at 2:00 p.m. in the Technology Building Lobby. The Russian group is visiting New Jersey through the Center for Citizen Initiatives, which implements programs that assist Russian citizens in securing economic and political reforms and fosters cooperative partnerships and relations between the United States and Russia. Ms. Gale Wayman, OCC Foundation Board member, is the local coordinator for the group of 13 visitors.
- ◆ Partnership with TraveLearn The college has joined the TraveLearn network of 300 colleges and universities in the nation that offers educational tours for adults in 17 countries worldwide. On-site lectures, seminars, and field experiences are provided by faculty escorts and in-country specialists. This format fosters an understanding of foreign cultures that is not available on more conventional travel tours. The TraveLearn program will be marketed to OCC Academy for Lifelong Learning members and the Ocean County community.

Soccer Player of the Week

The National Junior College Athletic Association has named OCC's Maggie Chussler as its Division I Women's Soccer Player of the Week for September 4th to 10th. Maggie plays in a forward position for the team and led the team to a 3-0 record during the week with a 6-2 win over Genesee, a 5-0 shutout against Bergen County, and a 2-1 conference win over Sussex County. In the first two games of the week, she had 5 goals and 1 assist for 11 points. She closed the week scoring both goals in the 2-1 win over Sussex. For the week, she collected 15 points on 7 goals and 1 assist.
