(BART 214) **I. Sophomore Quest: A Retention Initiative**

The second cohort of the Leadership Academy will present *The Sophomore Quest*. The Sophomore Quest is a student-centered program designed to instruct and empower students in the ownership of their college experience while simultaneously contributing to college-wide retention efforts. The presenters will examine how helping students develop a deeper association with the College through stronger connections to faculty, staff, and fellow students facilitates fuller, richer participation in campus life, leading to greater rates of retention and completion.
