Ocean County College Athletics

♦ The Ocean County College Women's Cross Country Team has had a great deal of success under Head Coach Ed Baynes. Last year, the team won the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division III National Championship; this year, the team finished as the NJCAA National Runner-Up.

The NJCAA Championship meet was held on November 13th at Sunken Meadow State Park in Long Island, New York. Angela Ciardelli was OCC's fastest runner, finishing 7th overall with a time of 21:05.80. Priscilla Robinson was the 2nd OCC runner to finish in 14th place with a time of 21:43.05. Alyssa Collier finished immediately after Priscilla in 15th place with a time of 21:45.00. For their excellent performances, Angela, Priscilla, and Alyssa were all named 2010 NJCAA Cross Country All-Americans.

Stephanie Paluchowski, Meghan Duffield, and Theresa Messano rounded out the Viking team with 20th, 29th, and 42nd place finishes, respectively, out of the 111 runner field. Mohawk Valley College, Utica, New York, won the meet, and SUNY Delhi, Oneonta, New York, placed third.

Assistant Athletic Director AJ Trump will attend Monday's meeting with Mr. Baynes and members of the Women's Cross Country Team so we may recognize their fine accomplishments.

The OCC Men's Cross Country Team finished its season in 13th place in the nation. Congratulations are extended to both the men's and women's teams.

Spring 2011 Colloquium

The Spring 2011 Colloquium is scheduled for Friday, January 21, 2011, in the Theatre of the Arts and Community Center. The Evening Colloquium for adjunct faculty will take place on Thursday, January 20, 2010.

Friday morning will begin with a continental breakfast from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. in the Center Lobby. Ocean County Arts High School Program

The Arts High School Program, administered by the Arts and Education Center, has been operating for many years in Middlesex and Monmouth counties and will begin in Ocean County in February 2011. The program is a special released-time opportunity for artistically gifted and talented teens to attend classes at OCC, and the successful completion of the courses will satisfy high school graduation requirements. The classes have also been accredited by OCC, and the credits may be used by the students to achieve an A.S. Degree in Performing Arts.

The program is open to all students in 9th through 12th grades, and participants are selected for the program by audition; Ocean County auditions will be held on Saturday, December 11th. Arts High School classes will meet for a 14-week term from February to May 2011. The courses of study include multi-genre writing, poetry, modern dance, jazz improv, music composition, brass ensemble, woodwind ensemble, percussion ensemble, musical theatre, theatre arts, visual arts, photography, and film making.

The program is made possible in part by a grant from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts/Department of State, a partner agency of the National Endowment for the Arts.

Dr. Nancy Gerry, OCC Director of School Relations, will be coordinating the program for the College.
