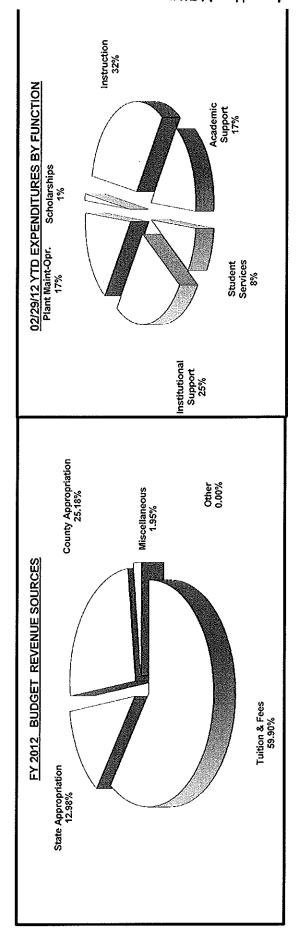
The following Finance Committee items are recommended to the Ocean County College Board of Trustees for approval at its meeting on March 26, 2012:

An additional \$7,000, for a maximum of \$592,316, to Concord Engineering Group, Inc., Voorhees, New Jersey, for a change order for the installation of alternate security and data systems as part of the engineering services for the Combined Heat and Power Plant at Ocean County College (contract originally awarded at the September 21, 2009, Board meeting) (Exhibit A-11)
- 5. Recommend adoption of a resolution authorizing Ocean County College to apply for grant funds from the Toms River Township Community Development Block Grant Program for ADA compliance renovations to the Barnegat Bay Partnership office, located at 117 Haines Street, Toms River, New Jersey, and, further, to designate the President as the authorized College official to submit the grant application (Exhibit A-12)

Combined Heat & Power Plant Project

AMENDMENT: Recommend the contract to Santorini Construction Co. be amended in the additional amount of \$10,699.00 for a total amount of \$5,655,173.00. The monies are needed for change order #9 (joining of the two (2) piece chiller). The original contract in the amount of \$5,550,000.00 was awarded at the March 28, 2011 Board of Trustees Meeting. Alternates E-1, E-2 and E-3 are not being accepted by Ocean County College.
