Regular Meeting

Minutes

July 25, 2019

The regularly scheduled monthly meeting of the Ocean County College Board of Trustees was called to order at 12:30 p.m. on Thursday, July 25, 2019, by Mr. Carl V. Thulin, Chair, in the Boardroom of the Administration Building on the College campus. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.

Call to Order

The announcement of public meeting was made by Mrs. Connie Bello in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975. Notice of this meeting was publicized through a resolution adopted at the November 2018 reorganization meeting and distributed as required by law.

Mr. Hatem Akl, Interim Associate Vice President of e-Learning, introduced the new Dean, e-Learning, Ms. Vivian Lynn. Dr. Konopka then introduced the new Dean, School of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, Dr. Sylvia Riviello.

Presentations

Dr. Konopka introduced Ms. Pamela Bogdan, College Lecturer II, Engineering, who shared with the Board a review of the Engineering Program's three to five-year roadmap, including an overview of the Engineering curriculum, plans for future growth to support student success, and transfer agreements with senior institutions following graduation. Dr. Konopka also explained discussions are ongoing with NJIT exploring a 3+1 degree in Engineering.

Presentations

Dr. Larson introduced Ms. Karen Smith, Vice President of University Relations at Kean University, who provided an overview of collaborative marketing efforts for Kean/Ocean. Campaigns include the marketing of programs on the main campus and the Southern Education Center with a focus on proximity and affordability. Ms. Smith reported that local and national advertising programs have been developed, as well as a national tour video that will highlight the Kean Union and Kean Ocean campuses.

An additional \$374,852, for a maximum total of \$20,504,852, to Wallace Brothers, Inc., Brick, New Jersey, to ensure completion of the Performing Arts Academy for Spring 2020 occupancy at Ocean County College (contract originally awarded at the May 10, 2018, Board retreat).

The Board acknowledged contract awards, as recommended by Noresco, LLC, Edison, New Jersey, on behalf of the New Jersey County College Electric Consortium, for electric Acknowledged supply services from August 2019 through August 2021 at participating New Jersey Community Colleges.

The Board accepted a \$5,200 grant from the Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation Arts Connect Grant Accepted Grant to subsidize the cost of the production of Layer the Walls, a puppet show that explores the stories of Irish, Italian, and Eastern European Jewish immigration between 1860 and 1909. Project Director: Mr. Mark Wilson, Director of Cultural Affairs. Project period: July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020.

Dr. Konopka shared meetings continue with the State Division of Labor regarding a possible apprenticeship degree program. Also, many of the College Lecturers have been busy working in the community, discussion continues on a 3+1 Nursing degree with Kean, grant proposals are being developed, and a healthcare assessment is underway.

Mr. Akl and Dr. Maysa Hayward, Assistant Vice President of International Programs, provided a report to the trustees on the status of the issuance of a decree authorizing the American Community College in Egypt.

Mr. Ken Malagiere, Executive Director, OCC Foundation, reported that scholarship applications for the fall semester will be accepted until August 16, 2019. He also discussed the Foundation's upcoming events, including the 6th Annual Alumni, Students, and Staff picnic on Friday, August 9, 2019, and the annual golf outing on October 16, 2019.

Dr. Larson introduced Dr. Steve Kubow, Acting Associate Vice President for Kean Ocean, and Dr. Jessica Adams, Associate Dean of Kean Ocean. Dr. Kubow reported renovations to the Gateway Building were approved by Kean University to expand and create a one-stop shop for Kean Ocean. Dr. Adams reported on the expanded offerings for the Southern Education Center, which will include the ability to complete several baccalaureate degrees on the SEC campus.
