PROCEDURE

- A. All teaching personnel who choose to include value for attendance in their course grading scheme must include their attendance requirements in course syllabi, and the attendance requirements must be announced at the first class meeting of each course.
- B. For all teaching personnel who choose to include value for attendance in their course grading scheme, excused absences are considered for the reasons listed below. Classwork and examinations missed due to excused absences must be made up as required by the instructor.
 - 1. Religious obligation or observance over the course of the term when submitted in writing to the instructor during the first week of class.
 - 2. Participation in College-sponsored events or activities, such as intercollegiate athletics or course trips.
 - 3. Active and reserve military training, jury duty, and subpoenas.
 - 4. Documented illness.
- C. Students who are pregnant or in the first six weeks of parenting following a birth may miss class for medical reasons and will be given the opportunity to make up work they missed without penalty, as required by the federal regulations outlined in the Education Act of 1972, Title IX (Sex Discrimination).
- D. If students anticipate missing more than one week of classes for serious illness or confidential/sensitive personal reasons, the instructor should be informed as soon as possible.

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
