OCEAN COUNTY COLLEGE STUDENT AWARDS CEREMONY

CHARLES READ MEMORIAL MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of OCC's first professor of Music, Charles Read, who taught at OCC from 1966 until 2000. Professor Read was also the founder and director of the OCC Community Chorus. \$100 is awarded to a graduating student with a 3.5 GPA or higher in all music classes who has been accepted into a four-year institution as a Music major.

THE HAYWARD VIKING 2025 SCHOLARSHIP

\$150 is awarded to honor a graduating EOF student who exemplifies Leadership, Service and Character.

VIKING ATHLETICS COMMITMENT AWARD

\$200 is awarded to a student who has shown outstanding commitment and support of the athletics program and loyalty to the College.

ARMANDO QUIROZ AWARD

Donated by Dr. Marilyn Kralik, \$200 is awarded to a graduating student for commitment to biliteracy and second language learning or advocating for cultural responsiveness in the community.

CHRISTOPHER W. MANNION SCHOLARSHIP

Donated by Marilyn Kralik, \$200 is awarded to a graduating student who has a demonstrated commitment to international travel for the purpose of academic achievement.

\$200 each is awarded to two students who have excelled academically, whose influence has been most constructive in the field of Athletics, and who has exhibited satisfactory scholarship, sound citizenship, and loyalty to the college.

\$200 each is awarded to two female students who have excelled academically, whose influence has been most constructive in the field of Athletics, and who has exhibited satisfactory scholarship, sound citizenship, and loyalty to the college.

Donated by Marilyn Kralik, \$200 is awarded to a graduating student who has actively supported the Fine Arts program at OCC.

THE MATHEMATICS CLUB AWARD

\$250 each is awarded to two graduating students pursuing a degree in Mathematics or related majors. Preference is given to students active in the Mathematics Club.

MEALS ON WHEELS OF OCEAN COUNTY AWARD

(in honor of Virginia and Jack Lamping)

\$250 is awarded to a graduating student interested in pursuing a career in Public Affairs, Policy, or Government.

OPERATION OCEAN HEROES SCHOLARSHIP

\$250 each is awarded to a military and veteran-affiliated student who has impacted student engagement through SALUTE honor society, student VA, VMRC work-study program or other student organization.

RICHARD M. TRIMBLE SCHOLARSHIP

\$250 is awarded to a graduating student who has excelled in historical research and academic development in the field of History. Donated by the OCC History Club in conjunction with the Jersey Shore Civil War Round Table in recognition of the late Richard Trimble.

JENNIE HORNE CECE AWARD

Donated by Dottie Cece LaPosa in honor of her mother, Jennie Horne Cece, a working mom with eight children, \$300 is given to a working mother raising her children and pursuing her education simultaneously.

JOSEPH HATHAWAY COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER AWARD

A \$500 scholarship donated by Professor Lynn A. Kenneally and Jeffrey J. McWeeney in recognition of Professor Kenneally's parents, who encouraged education.

JOYCE PREVITE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$500 is awarded to an outstanding graduate of the Nursing program who has maintained a 3.0 GPA or better.

MICHAEL D. VENA MEMORIAL MUAA SCHOLARSHIP

Donated by the Municipal Utilities Authorities Association of Ocean County, \$500 each is awarded to two graduates transferring to a four-year institution and majoring in Environmental Sciences or directly related fields.

\$500 is awarded to a graduate of the Criminal Justice program in honor of Probation Officer Todd Benintente, who served and protected his community over his long career.

DR. STEPHEN A. KUBOW MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Donated by his former colleagues in memory of Kean Ocean's Associate Vice President, \$500 is awarded to a graduating student transferring to Kean University or Kean Ocean.

TUTORING SCHOLARSHIP

Donated by retired professor of mathematics Dr. William Rickert and his wife Lois, \$500 is awarded to an outstanding graduate who also served as a peer tutor within OCC Tutoring Center.

NORCIA ASPIRING ATTORNEY AWARD

Donated by OCC alum RJ Norcia (Class of 2010), \$750 is awarded to a graduating student who has demonstrated interest in attending law school and becoming a practicing attorney in the State of New Jersey.

ANDREW T. BARAN SCHOLARSHIP

\$750 is awarded to a graduating student who has enrolled in a four-year institution to complete a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice.

SOROPTIMIST CLUB OF TOMS RIVER SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 is awarded to a graduating female student continuing her education at a four-year institution.

SOROPTIMIST SIGMA AWARD

This scholarship aims to empower women, foster their personal and professional growth, and promote a more equitable and inclusive society. \$1,000 is awarded to a female graduating student with a 3.0 GPA or better, continuing in a four-year institution.

JOSEPH J. QUATTROCK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 is awarded to a nontraditional graduating student with a 3.0 GPA or better, continuing in a four-year institution.

DOUGLAS C. KING MEMORIAL

\$1,000 is awarded to a graduate of the Criminal Justice program who is pursuing a four-year degree in Criminal Justice.

CARLEEN STERLING ORSI MEMORIAL AWARD

\$1,000 is awarded to two graduates transferring to a four-year institution. (Renewable for a second year.)

LAVERNE D. AND ROBERT R. WEIGOLD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 is awarded to an outstanding student demonstrating scholarship abilities and an interest in the area of English or the Humanities.



40 FOR 40 GRADUATING AWARD

\$1,000 each awarded to two students in honor of Foundation Executive Director Kenneth J. Malagiere's 40th birthday; guests were invited to contribute to several opportunities, including this unrestricted graduating award. The goal was to raise \$40,000 and they were successful in raising more than double.

ALUMNI FUND FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

\$1,000 is awarded for scholarships and opportunities for students and alumni of Ocean County College.

DR. CHARLES ABELES SCHOLARSHIP

This \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a student who demonstrates outstanding aptitude in languages, literature, or philosophy.

DOVER BRICK BEACH FIRST AID PUBLIC HEALTH SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 each is awarded to three graduating students in honor of dedicated volunteers who gave of themselves in service to the community. Dover-Brick Beach First Aid Squad offers financial support to those pursuing studies in the Public Health/Sciences field.

JOHN F. POWELL AWARD

This \$1,000 scholarship is named in memory of President Monaco's father. Born and raised in Virginia, he worked as a statistician for the Census Bureau, but his love was supporting those who wanted to change their lives through education. He would be very proud of OCC students.

MILDRED KEHNE AWARD

This \$1,000 scholarship is named in memory of Donald Kehne's mother. Born and raised in South Dakota, Mrs. Kehne trained to be a nurse and served in the Pacific Theatre during WWII.
